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

Planned Parking Management

We are planning to simplify parking regulations on 34th Avenue between E Spring and E Pike Streets to make most parking 2-hour time-limited parking, 7 AM to 6 PM, Monday through Saturday. Without these time limits, any vehicle can legally




park for up to 72 hours in the business district, which limits access to businesses.

We also plan to make the parking spaces on the north side of E Union St between 34th and 35th Avenues 2-hour time-limited parking 7 AM to 6 PM, Monday through Saturday.

Existing load zones, designated disabled parking spaces, and bus stops will be maintained. On-street parking will remain free of charge. Please let us know if you need a new load zone or changes to an existing load zone.
