

# 23RD AVE E VISION ZERO PROJECT


### **Construction starts this August**

Crews working for the Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) will begin safety enhancements on 23rd Ave E/24th Ave E. This work is part of the City's Vision Zero Program. Learn more about the City's Vision Zero Program at

This project improves safety for people who drive, walk, bike, and take transit in the area.

We're designing 23rd Ave E/24th Ave E between E John St and Boyer Ave E by changing the 2 northbound lanes to 1 northbound lane and 1 center turn lane.



#### **Construction schedule**

Work will proceed in 3 phases and take at least 10 days and includes: crews marking changes, removing existing road markings, with noisy work from 9 AM – 7 PM, and installing signs and new markings from 7 AM – 7 PM

# What to expect during construction

- 1 lane in each direction will be maintained, with occasional lane shifts to one side of the street
- Crews will work throughout the corridor at various locations and weekend work is possible.
- Slight traffic and transit delays
- Typical construction impacts like noise, dust, and vibrations

No planned detours or full road closures and transit stops will remain open.

#### What's next


Later this year, we'll add skid-resistant surfaces at intersections with high collision rates. Please check the project webpage for schedule details.
