# RAINIER AVE S CORRIDOR PROJECT - PHASE 2

August 2017

## PROJECT BACKGROUND

Rainier Ave S is an arterial street in southeast Seattle supporting retail shopping, restaurants, schools, parks, and activity centers. The people of southeast Seattle have come from all corners of the globe, bringing their own cultures, languages, and food with a shared determination to succeed in their new home.

## PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Over the last 10 years, there have been nearly 3,600 total collisions along Rainier Ave S. On average, there is 1 crash per day that takes 45 minutes to clear.

In 2015, we changed the street design of Rainier Ave S between S Alaska St to S Kenny St to reduce speeding and the number and severity of crashes. We've seen positive changes on Rainier Ave S since, including:

- Zero serious injury or fatal crashes
- Reduced frequency of crashes
- Fewer people speeding
- Improved bus travel times

We want to continue these outcomes south on Rainier Ave S between S Kenny St and S Henderson St and want to know which alternative you prefer. (See alternative designs on reverse). **Your feedback will help us shape the future of Rainier Ave S.**




# RAINIER AVE S BETWEEN S KENNY ST AND S HENDERSON ST

## ALTERNATIVE 1 - Dedicated bus lanes



- Includes northbound bus lane
- Right turns and access to businesses maintained

## ALTERNATIVE 2 - Protected bike lanes



- Includes turn lanes at major intersections. See image below.
