### how do straws get into the ocean?

Plastic straws end up in the ocean primarily through human error. Oftentimes plastic straws are:

- 1) littered,
- 2) left on beaches in coastal communities and seaside resorts globally,
- 3) blown out of trash cans (frequently overfilled) or transport boats and vehicles.

Seattle's waste management infrastructure is sound, but not all communities have the same level of accountability.

Remember, all gutters and storm drains lead to our ocean.

### can't we just recycle plastic straws?

Due to their small size, shape and weight, plastic straws fall through screening equipment at recycling facilities and are sent to landfill.

### what about those who need straws?

We aren't anti-straw, just anti-plastic straw.

Everyone deserves to enjoy your delectable cocktails, coffee & pop!

We've been working with the disability community to identify straws that work best for their physical needs.

Anyone who has had a stroke, has autism, MS or other **life changing physical issue needs a straw**. Often, a compostable plastic straw or a paper straw may work best for them. So keep a few on hand just in case — please.

## how do we solve this?

By having a bit of fun and showing leadership from the city that defines sustainability — Seattle.

### WHAT ABOUT PLASTIC STRAWS ARE BAD FOR OUR OCEAN?

### MOST ARE NOT RECYCLABLE

While some straws are made from #2 or #5 plastic (which is recyclable) these straws are too lightweight and often don't make it through the recycling sorter.


