Major Baseline Rate Assumptions

- Water Fund
 - Slightly Declining demand (retail)
 - Low tap revenue growth
 - Updated wholesale revenues
- Drainage and Wastewater Fund
 - Slight declining demand
 - Wastewater treatment costs
- Solid Waste Fund
 - Contract costs +4.0%/year
 - No bond issuances

• All Funds

- Lower bond interest rates
- UDP is 3% of retail rate revenue
- No changes to the regulatory environment
- CIP Accomplishment Rate
 - 85% Water Fund
 - 85% DWF (95% Ship Canal & Sediments projects)
 - 90% Solid Waste



COVID-19 Rate Assumptions

- Water Fund
 - Declining demand (retail)
 - Lower tap revenue growth
- Drainage and Wastewater Fund
 - Declining demand
 - Reduced development fees
- Solid Waste Fund
 - Reduced commercial demand
 - Reduced transfer station fees
 - RSF withdrawal in 2020

• All Funds

- Additional UDP enrollment of 5,000 through 2020
- Cash Flow delays into 2021
- O&M Reductions
- CIP Reductions
 - Facilities

 - RSF withdrawal in 2021
- Drainage and Wastewater Fund
 - Declining demand through 2021
 - Reduced development fees through 2021
- Solid Waste Fund
 - Reduced commercial demand through 2021
 - Reduced transfer station fees through 2021
 - RSF withdrawal in 2020 and 2021

• All Funds

- Additional UDP enrollment of 5,000 through 2020 and 3,000 in 2021
- Cash Flow delays into 2022
