This spring, I joined the Pump Station 22 Retrofit and Force Main Replacement project team as the Project Manager. I look forward to working with you as we enter the construction phase of this project and am grateful for the foundation the previous project manager, Jerry Waldron, established.

Since 2018, Seattle Public Utilities has been working in the Magnolia neighborhood to design the project, including improvements to the existing pump station, sewer mains, and street-end, public open space. We started the construction contracting process earlier this year, and we are pleased to announce that we have recently executed a construction contract. Construction is scheduled to begin as early as fall 2019 and we expect it to take 12 to 14 months to complete.
