




### As the Average Studio Rent has Increased in King County...






### 6,320 people are living unsheltered in King County



71% are unsheltered in Seattle






### Homelessness Disproportionately Affects People Of Color





## What are the Results?

# **Key Results Q1 + Q2 2018**



18,356 households served so far, an increase of 946 compared to the same time last year



Rapid Rehousing has an 80% rate of exit to permanent housing



2,644 exits to permanent housing and 1,815 maintaining housing (total of 4,459)



Enhanced shelter have an exit rate to housing 5x higher (21%) than basic shelters (4%)




692 more exits to permanent housing compared to the same time last year



10% Increase in rate of exits to permanent housing for Native American/Alaska Native and Black/African American households


# We Are Increasing Bridge Housing And Shelter by 25% to Serve More than 500 Additional People Each Night





### Continued Commitment to Create More Affordable Housing

From 2018 to 2021, **2,500 new City-funded affordable rental housing units** and over **1,900 new MFTE affordable units will come online.** 



Historically, every dollar the City invests in affordable housing is leveraged 2 to 3 times by other resources.
