Our Mission: put Seattle's fruits trees to their best and fullest use, so that everyone in our community shares in the value of fruit

Our Goals:

The Great Seattle Fruit Harvest

2018 represented our biggest expansion: we grew to serve ALL of Seattle and reached into South King County

Our Growth:

- Already harvested more than 25,000 pounds of fruit!
- Registered more than 200 new trees
- Will host up to 15 Harvest Hubs, with volunteer harvesters
- Will collect fruit from 100 Harvest Boxes, to increase efficiency





Stewardship & Education

We re-launched our education workshops to include an active stewardship component, to reach a more diverse population; embed our work more deeply in service, and connect more neighbors to the City's orchards.

Our Impact:

- We engaged several hundred volunteers in direct service,
- We graduated 18 new Master Fruit Tree Stewards
- We trained 4 new Orchard Stewards to support City trees
- Our training workshops resulted in the direct care of more 50 city.







Youth Programming

More than 300 underserved youth connected to our City's orchards and harvest through our Harvest Club and Harvest Team programs!

Our Training Program:

- 20 Middle Schoolers became trained as Master Fruit Tree Stewards
- 1 SYEP intern trained as a Harvest Team member
- Youth worked together to assess and map trees at 3 orchards







Save Seattle's Apples

We launched our third year of the campaign to protect our City's apple and pear trees!

Our Reach:

- Distributed 10,000 pest prevention packs across Seattle
- Netted more than 50 trees in public spaces
- Launched a pilot study of net & design efficiency at Meridian
- Distributed more than 100 yard signs to participating homes



We launched Tree Care Services in January and blew past our annual projections by May.
