April 18, 2022 Civil Service Commission Monthly Meeting Minutes Approved: May 16, 2022

1. CALL TO ORDER:

Commission Chair Mary Wideman-Williams called the meeting to order at 2:00 pm. The meeting was held via WebEx per the Washington Governor's Proclamation No. 20-28.

2. LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT:

Commission Chair Wideman-Williams opened the meeting with the Land Acknowledgment-The City of Seattle Civil Service Commission acknowledges that we are on the traditional land of the first people of Seattle, the Duwamish. We honor with gratitude the land, and the Duwamish people, past and present.

3. INTRODUCTIONS (In Attendance)

Commission: Commission Chair Mary Wideman-Williams, Commissioner Evan Chinn

Staff & Counsel: Andrea Scheele, Executive Director.

Guests: Thomas Griffith, Appellant; Anna Silver, Counsel for Mr. Griffith; Spruce Metzger, SPU

- 4. <u>PUBLIC COMMENT:</u> No members of the public requested to give comment.
- 5. <u>WELCOME COMMISSIONER EVAN CHINN</u>: Commissioner Wideman-Williams welcomed Commissioner Chinn and expressed her appreciation for his service. Commissioner Chinn stated that he was glad to be of service to the City and the civil service commission.

6. <u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES</u>

• **February 14, 2022:** The commission reviewed the minutes of the February 14, 2022, CSC meeting. Commissioner Chinn moved to accept the minutes as written. Commissioner Wideman-Williams seconded the motion. The minutes were approved by acclamation and will be signed by the chair.

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7. COMMISSION MEETING DATES MAY-DECEMBER

Commissioners and staff determined that the June 20, 2022 meeting would be rescheduled to June 27, 2022 at 3 pm, to accommodate for the Juneteenth holiday.

8. CASE STATUS REPORT AND APPEALS

Griffith v. SPU, CSC no. 22-01-013- The issues before the commission are to identify and discuss any potential conflicts of interest, and decide whether the CSC will hear the appeal, or delegate the hearing of the appeal. Mr. Griffith (Appellant) and his counsel, Ms. Silver were present. HR and Labor Relations Manager Spruce Metzger was present for SPU. Director Scheele reported that Mr. Griffith filed with the CSC a timely appeal of his termination by SPU, after exhausting the Employee Grievance Procedure.

Prior to the meeting, Commissioner Wideman-Williams identified a potential conflict of interest, because she and the appellant worked together years ago and remain friendly but are not close friends. Commissioners Wideman-Williams stated that to the best of her memory, the last time she saw Mr. Griffiths was 6 or 7 years ago, when they had lunch together. They worked together for several years, until 2007. They follow each other on social media and occasionally send birthday greetings, or similar infrequent communications. Mr. Griffith agreed with Commissioner Wideman-Williams' characterization of their relationship. Commissioner Wideman-Williams said that she did not feel that her relationship with the appellant would prevent her from making a fair decision in this matter, based on the facts and applicable laws/rules.

There was brief discussion among several attendees that that being acquainted with one or more the parties did not disqualify any commissioner from hearing an appeal, and that it was likely to happen again in the future, as both Commissioner Chinn and Commissioner Wideman-Williams are former City employees.

Director Scheele stated that a potential reason to consider delegation the appeal to was that the fact that there are only two commissioners currently, and a third may not join for several months.

Ms. Silver stated that the appellant was interested in as speedy appeal process, if possible. She inquired whether the Office of Hearing Examiner had the requisite subject matter expertise to hear a civil service appeal, and Director Scheele said although OHR does not frequently hear civil service appeals, OHE is competent and authorized to hear the matter.

Commissioner Chinn made a motion to delegate the appeal to the Office of Hearing Examiner, to make findings of fact and conclusions of law. The CSC shall the right to review and affirm, modify, or remand all or part of the decision, per to CSC Rule 5.08.2. Commissioner Wideman-Williams seconded the motion. Neither party objected or provided further comment. The motion passed, and Director Scheele was directed to prepare the order of delegation to OHE.

Garza v. SDOT, CSC No. 22-01-015- The Executive Director reported that this appeal was filed, but that more information is needed to determine jurisdiction.

9. OPMA AND PROCLAMATION 20-28- UPDATE ON REMOTE IN-PERSON PARTICIPATION

Director Scheele provided an update on the OPMA, which were that beginning in June 2022, commissioners will be able to participate remotely in meetings, and that public comment will be required at all meetings where final action takes place. We expect at some point the proclamation suspending the in-person requirements of the OMPA will be lifted, and then we will open the hearing space to the public or anyone else who wants to attend. Staff are preparing for this eventuality.

Commissioner Wideman-Williams stated that the ease of attendance remotely has been nice during the pandemic, but she would prefer that the CSC retreat be in person, if safe and possible. She suggested June or July, once the new elected commissioner is available.

10. UPDATE- PERSONNEL RULE PREAMBLE, 1.1, 1.4, AND 11) RELATING TO ANTI-HARASSMENT ANTI-DISCRIMINATION (AHAD)

Director Scheele provided a report that the recent changes to the Personnel Rules were a result of an Executive Order by Mayor Durkan, and a result of many employees' work on an interdepartmental team that she and Commissioner Chinn were in 2018 and 2019. The changes are to align the rules with the City's anti-harassment and anti-discrimination work. They expand the definition of "workplace misconduct." Seem to create a new right that may require enforcement by the CSC, and describe the Human Resources Investigations Unit. They also describe requirements for tracking and reporting violations. She mentioned highlights of the new rules, which were included in the meeting packet.

11. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REPORT

Departmental Work and Budget Update: Director Scheele provided an update to the commission on ongoing departmental work and budget. This is the busiest part of Police and Fire Exam's year, and that has required substantial involvement by Director Scheele. She reported that she submitted baseline adjustment budget requests for 2023, in addition to the April budget memo for the 2023-2024 biennium.

Update on CSC Special Election for Employee-Elected Member: Director Scheele reported that voting for CSC members had begun by mail and would begin electronically on April 25. Voting will close on April 29. There may be a result as soon as May 8, but a runoff election will likely be necessary because the winner must receive a majority of the votes, pursuant to SMC election code. The meeting materials include profiles for the candidates.

12. EXECUTIVE SESSION (MAY BE CANCELLED IF NOT NEEDED): There was no Executive Session.
