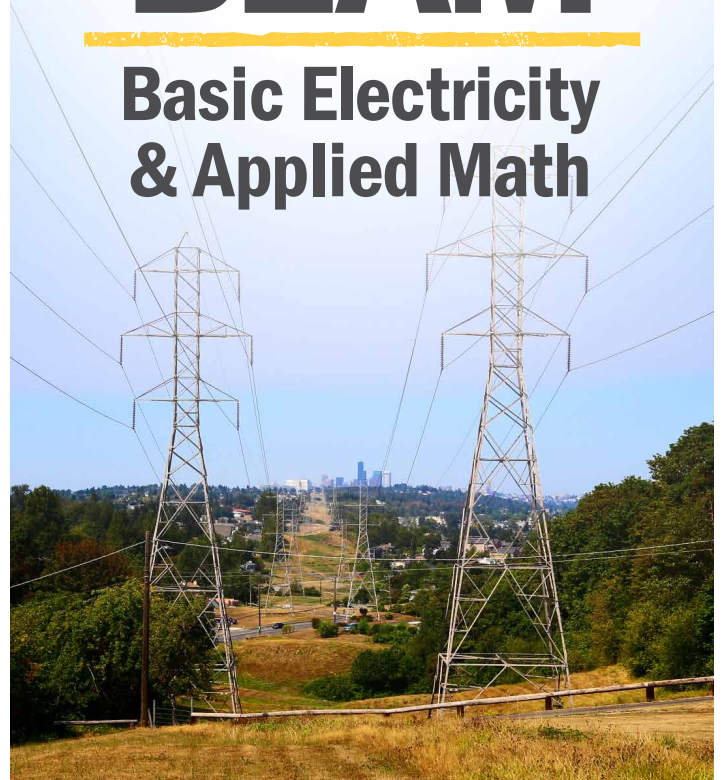

BEAM is an educational program for people who:

- have training and/or experience in the electrical field, but need to brush up on their skills;
- are interested in the electrical trades and/or apprenticeship programs;
- have little or no electrical training or experience, but are interested in learning ;
- have taken basic math classes, but want to learn algebra for career advancement ;
- are willing to commit to attending classes two (2) nights per week for 12-14 weeks.

BEAM is designed to give a comprehensive introduction to:

- basic electrical theory and the practical application of that theory;
- applied math (math used for electrical work) and basic algebra;
- oral-interview success skills and practical experience.

Approximate Cost

\$500 for tuition, textbook and student parking

When scheduled, classes are held two nights per week from 5:30-8:30 pm for 12 weeks at the Georgetown campus of South Seattle Community College.
