Dear Seattle City Council members,

I am writing to express my interest in serving as the interim council member for District 5, filling the seat vacant following Cathy Moore's departure. I believe the City Council is doing a great job tackling the main issues confronting our growing metropolis, and I would like to assist and further those efforts. As a longtime resident and active community member, I am eager to contribute my skills and passion for public service to help shape the future of our city.

The job of City Councilmember is a group project for which you don't often pick your teammates. In this case, however, you get to fill this interim position. What is it you are looking for in someone to represent District 5 and support your efforts to improve Seattle?

Background

I have lived in Seattle since 2010, and in Washington State my entire life. I love this city. And it's people. Over the past year, I have met with Council member Moore several times and have been involved with several groups in Maple Leaf and beyond to help residents understand and move toward consensus for the One Seattle Plan.

Collaboration and Policy

Every policy issue involves tradeoffs–addressing public safety and homelessness cost money. Protecting trees and/or parking is often at odds with a growing population. These are tough decisions. Public goods have costs, and the council must weigh those as they work to solve the challenges of a growing metropolis. As an interim council member, the role must involve adding to the collaboration in progress, not trying to move in a different direction. Studying economics at WWU gave me a grasp of the tradeoffs inherent in policy decisions and I'm ready to support the Council in their policy work.

Community and Public Service

While living in Maple Leaf the last 5 years, I've attended many community council sessions and One Seattle Plan sessions, working to understand my neighbor's goals for our community. I have the support of several neighborhood groups, including a neighborhood working group helping residents understand the upcoming code and zoning ordinance changes. Prior to the pandemic, I was a longtime leader and mentor with Young Life, helping high school boys through their formative years to learn and find their place in the world.

In conversations with neighbors and clients, transportation, public safety, schools, and housing affordability are the big issues. Let's keep working on these together to develop sustainable policies that benefit all residents.
