HB 1589	Concerning the authority of peace officers to use force (would allow for force to be used to take someone into custody).	Representative Walsh et al.	First reading	Vote to Oppose – seems to be aimed at rolling back aspects of HB 1310
HB 1690	Concerning the use of deception by law enforcement officers during custodial investigations	Representative Peterson	First reading	Vote to Support
HB 1692	Promoting racial equity in the criminal legal system by eliminating drive-by shooting as a basis for elevating murder in the first degree to aggravated murder in the first degree.	Representatives Simmons, Hackney, and Ryu	First reading	Vote to Support – however, this speaks to the issue of increased crime that community has spoken against.
HB 1719	Concerning the use and acquisition of military equipment by law enforcement agencies.	Representatives Bronoske, Johnson (Jesse), and Bateman	Scheduled for hearing on 1/11/22 at 8:00am	Vote to support
HB 1726	Modifying standard for use of physical force by peace officers.	Representatives Goodman and Johnson (Jesse)	Scheduled for hearing on 1/11/22 at 8:00am	Vote to Oppose

HB 1735	Modifying the standard for use of force by peace officers.	Representatives Johnson (Jesse) and Rule	Scheduled for hearing on 1/11/22 at 8:00am	Vote to Oppose
SB 5522	Increasing the penalty for assaulting a law enforcement officer (focus on unlawful assembly or riot context).	Senator Padden	First reading	Vote to Oppose – this may not be supported by the community at-large.
SB 5485	Prohibiting traffic stops for certain violations	Senator Nguyen and Senator Nobles	Reintroduced by Resolution	Vote to Support
