Participating in the Budget Process

Budget Process Overview

Budget Hearings: Central Staff Presentations

October 13 - October 16

To better understand the mayor's proposed amendments, the council unpacks individual department budgets. The council's policy experts — Central Staff — do a deep dive into the departmental budgets. Councilmembers raise questions and identify issues they'll have to address in the council's budget.

Budget Deliberations: Balancing Package, Discussion, and Amendment Voting

October 27 - November 16

Councilmembers create, explain, and discuss their amendments. There are two types of budget amendments:

1. **Council Budget Actions (CBAs)**
 - CBAs change revenue, expenditures, staff positions, create provisos, and other actions with financial implications.
2. **Statements of Legislative Intent (SLIs)**
 - SLIs state the council's intent, gives guidance about city policy, call for additional study or reporting, etc.

Final Action: City Council Vote

November 19 - 20

The council takes two final votes on its budget – the first vote as the Budget Committee, and the second final vote as the full City Council. After the council passes the budget, it's sent to the mayor for signature.
