- DEEL leadership facilitated a discussion with LOC members regarding impacts of COVID-19 to DEEL's program execution, funding allocation, and policy priorities.
- Early Learning speakers highlighted efforts to mitigate COVID-19 transmission, increase
 family and student supports, and stabilize early childhood education businesses. DEEL
 supported vaccination and booster outreach and distributed personal protective equipment
 (PPE) and Antigen test kits to community-based organizations (CBOs), childcare, and
 preschool providers. DEEL also established COVID-19 contingency plans to provide remote
 services and distributed home learning kits to families.

Legislation was submitted to City Council in summer 2022 to formalize DEEL's authority to extend preschool programming into summer.
