DF	JS provided clarification request on underspend reserve offsetting costs or reducing property tax levy required.
ES	Question to the order of procession of budget acceptance. JS – DEEL proposes to the MO who proposes to CC
LTB	Is a funding opportunity available? JS – 1-additional underspend is anticipated at the end of 2024.
MS	Clarity on the cause for facility grants underspend in Early Learning

	JS-The spending did not happen within the time period, spending in this case was dependent upon demand. LDC – Organizational capacity grants (pre-pandemic a NGO orchestrated the process for DEEL) Post-pandemic it was identified as an underutilized resource that may benefit from reallocation.
DF	Can the proposed \$2M for summer learning be earmarked for literacy development?
	DC-Yes, literacy development is within the scope of a variety of eligible program offerings of organizations applying for these resources.
SL	Concerning the \$2M proposed to be allocated to K-12 will any be going to EL? Was the original source of the underspend the EL division?
	JS - Confirming the vast majority of the underspend is coming from the EL division; none of it will go back to the EL division as it is proposed, hence the reason of the need for the vote.
	SL – Concerns expression on the ratio of children with special needs to teachers and expressing support of financially supporting this matter. LDC – In 2025 DEEL will be doubling its Comprehensive Supports
LTB	Would like to see a broader shift of underspend allocations to not just Early Learning.
SG	Is the \$2M equally spread through K-12 Does 12 mean rising seniors or matriculating postsecondary?
	JS-This allocation will go to a specific, currently funded, program that DEEL is currently funding. It is typically rising high school seniors.
ES	Why these two programs in particular? Summer learning had been budgeting to run out so why was it not funded to go that long and why are we funding it now? JS -Summer Learning was not originally included in FEPP and through the course of
	the levy the department has been locating funds to provide an opportunity that has proven successful.
	ES-What is the criteria for success?
	JS-Are they doing well? Are they proving impact? If we were to end the program would it cause harm? Is it consistent with the impacts detailed in the IE Plan? We have not been using solely underspend to fund summer learning.
