## WASHINGTON FILMWORKS ANNOUNCES 2015 FUNDS SPENT

# **WASHINGTON FILMWORKS**

Washington Filmworks Board of Directors Chair Don Jensen announced this week that the state's 2015 \$3.5 million film competitiveness fund has been committed, just two months after beginning accepting applications. One feature film (Todd Rohal's *Sweet Cheeks*), one television series (SyFy's *Z Nation*), and the Innovation Lab and Commercialize Seattle initiatives will receive funding in 2015. Four 2015



productions with budget totals of \$66 million were turned away because of lack of funding, and Filmworks will consider no further requests for 2015.

# SIFF ANNOUNCES OPENING NIGHT FILM, 'SPY'

Always good to start off with laughter, right? The 41st annual Seattle International Film Festival (SIFF) will kick off May 14 with *Spy*, the new comedy from director Paul Feig (*Bridesmaids*, *The Heat*). The film, which will open in wide release June 5, stars *Bridesmaids* alums Melissa McCarthy and Rose Byrne, along with Jason Statham, Jude Law and



Alison Janney. Feig will attend the gala opening-night screening at McCaw Hall, and participate in a Q & A following the screening.

# THE FUTURE OF WASHINGTON FILM IS IN THE LEGISLATURE'S HANDS

#### **SEATTLE MET**

Senate Bill 6027 is currently working its way through the state legislature, which, if passed, could bolster the state's film industry and provide a powerful enticement for major productions. Washington's tax incentive program for film production is the fifth smallest in the country,



with a cap of \$3.5 million. By comparison, Oregon has a \$10 million cap, while Vancouver, B.C., sets aside \$250 million for its program. SB 6027 would raise the cap on the incentive to \$7 million over the next two years, with a gradual increase to \$10 million by 2019. More than 250 businesses and the state labor council have endorsed the bill, making this the first tax incentive the council has supported.
