Building 2 is the last vacant hangar/workspace/office space in Magnuson Park. Over many years, multiple studies have proposed developing the building into a soundstage, multi-use space, artist loft, sports facility, and other ideas. Recent radium abatement and property improvements now offer a



renewed look at what the building may be able to become. The Office of Film + Music's Chris Swenson will be on hand with an overview of the 2009 soundstage feasibility study performed for the building.
