KEEP FILM IN WA ANNOUNCES NEW HOUSE AND SENATE BILLS

The Keep Film in WA campaign has announced House Bill 1527 and Senate Bill 5502. The bills maintain the Motion Picture Competitiveness Program at its current level of \$3.5 million per year, as well as allows for the special allocation of money to major motion pictures portraying a significant historical event in Washington State.
