Key Performance Targets

- Complete 1.5 audit projects per staff member annually, with the target based on a comparison to peer group audit offices.
- Complete 16-20 projects annually that result in more efficient and effective City programs and/or greater adherence to laws, regulations, and policies.

2002 Proposed Program Changes

Delete 1.0 FTE permanent Administrative Specialist II position in the Office of City Auditor in 2002. This will be replaced by intermittent Administrative Specialist II positions with a combined full time equivalent not to exceed 1.0 in order to better meet the cyclical demands of the Auditor's office workload. This position assists in the production of audit reports and other seasonally-demanded administrative duties. This change does not require any additional funding.

2002 Adopted Program Changes

Due to the combined impact of the region's economic downturn and the passage of I-747, reduce the Office of the City Auditor's budget by \$48,443 in 2002. This reduction comes through holding vacant positions, maintaining current salaries, and other efficiencies.
