  - a. Coalition in California is launching campaign for OSHA
    - i. Should be a federal law instead of bit by bit and state by state
  - b. NO APPROVAL of minutes
- 2. OLS Update
  - a. Jennifer
    - i. Presentations from community partners who have been doing this work for three months now
      - 1. La Garifona, Casa Latina, Fair Works, Centro Cultural Mexicano
