App-Based Worker Minimum Payment

Provides covered app-based workers right to minimum payment, transparency, and flexibility



App-Based Paid Sick & Safe Time

Provides covered workers with paid sick and safe time



App-Based Worker Deactivation Rights Effective Jan 1, 2025

Provides covered app-based workers with rights and protection related to deactivation



OLS Ten Year Anniversaries

OLS became a separate division within the Office for Civil Rights in 2015 and an independent department in 2017.

Both Minimum Wage and Wage Theft Ordinances became effective on 4/1/2015.
