Staff Liaison Updates

Staff Liaison Jenkins reminded the commissioners that according to the commission bylaws, subcommittee meetings need to be included with regular meeting minutes on the website. She asked that commissioners send staff liaisons their subcommittee meeting minutes 10 days before each Community Involvement Commission meeting.

Guest Speakers with the Seattle Community Police Commission

Jo-Nathan Thomas – Started in the commission in March 2023, leading the role to rebuild relationships with Seattle communities. Trust has been very limited between community and police enforcement since the 2012 SPD killing of John T. Williams, no reestablishment of trust building from SPD has been given.

Mergitu Argo – Community Engagement Rep helping to bridge community with SPD commissions to share real life experiences with BIPOC families and African communities.

- No new data was shared with CIC from SCPC. Community Police crime dashboard was very limited on data updates. CIC advocates for the data to be publicly shared.
- Backgrounds of the SCPC: 21 commissioners, 7 elected by council member, 7 elected by mayor, 7 elected by Police Department.
 - CPC: Community Police Commission, establishing relationships with community.
 - o CIO: Office & Police Accountability
 - Seattle Office of Inspector General: Policy development, community engagement and investigation
