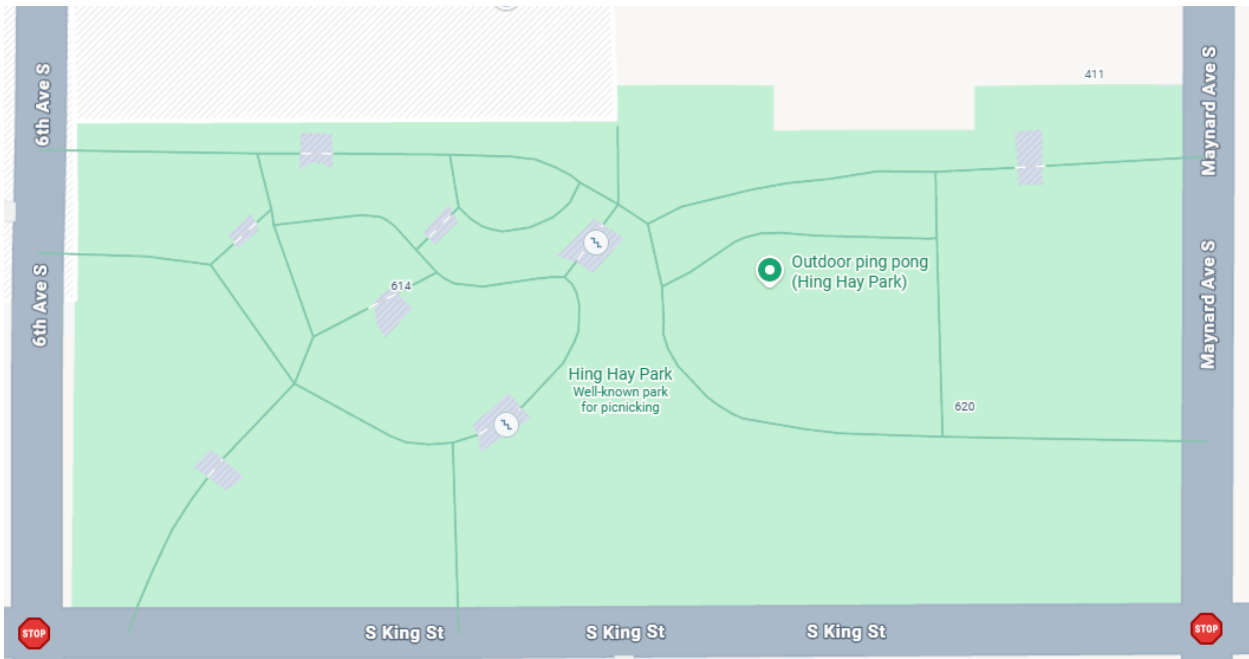
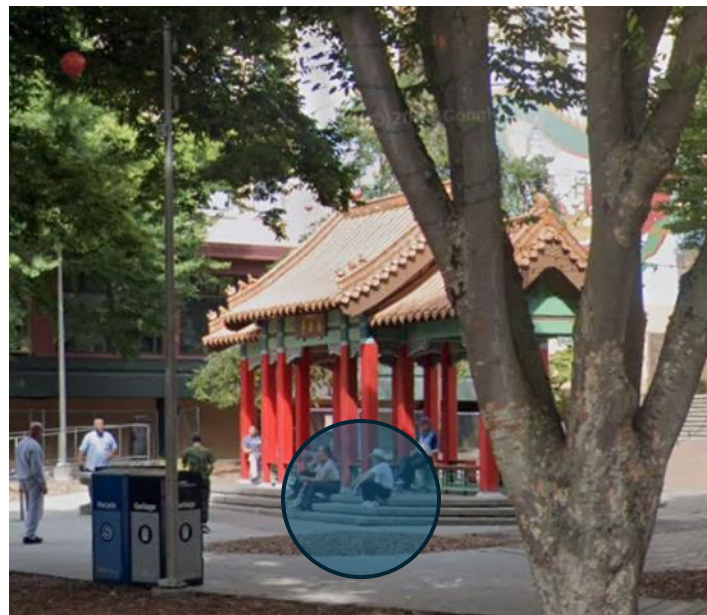


Hing Hay Park – SPR Tree Installation 2026

Seattle Parks and Recreation Urban Forestry is proposing to plant one (1) tree, a Crepe Myrtle “Natchez” (*Lagerstroemia indica*) in an existing vacant shrub bed area of Hing Hay Park. Park location: 423 Maynard Ave S, Seattle WA 98104 (Parcel # **DV0063339**). Planting is expected to take place between October of 2026 and January of 2027. Parks will maintain the tree for five years thereafter, including regular watering and mulching.

Proposed Tree Details: One Crepe Myrtle “Natchez”, *Lagerstroemia indica*, to match the existing trees in surrounding landscape. *L. indica* Natchez grows to a maximum height of 20-30 ft with a width of 10-13 ft. Produces clusters of white flowers in mid-summer to early fall. It is adaptable to a variety of soil types and become highly drought-tolerant once established. The Natchez cultivar is highly resistant to common diseases such as powdery mildew, rust, and leaf spot.
