# Our intent

Knowing that our refrigerated display cases were failing and looking around there were other things to repair, we decided to take the time to refresh the retail bakery space.

It has been important to continually honor our French roots and balance the history of over 40 years in Pike Place. Our choices in layout and materials hopefully reflect this well.

## Overview of **Remodel Elements**

**1 CASES** | New cases with lower profile and remote refrigeration

**2 CABINETRY** Updates to emphasize 'scratch bakery' and accommodate the new cases

**3 COUNTERTOPS** Update with similar material because of wear and tear

**4 RAMP** | For improved ADA accessibility and customer experience

**5 SEATING** | Front window seating remains unchanged with additional ADA




6 **RETAIL FLOOR** Current floor is no longer made. Replacing with concrete tile that brings a French essence and durability

**7 PAINT & WALLS** | Lightening up the space with a creamy shade as well as removing worn wainscoting

**8 LIGHTING** | Powder coat existing historic lights to maintain original lighting design





Material Palette

Keeping the warmth of the bakery, we chose to bring that out with more wood tones that are reminiscent of France and the Pacific Northwest. Using creams and browns adds to that warmth as well, letting the food be the main attraction.

#### MATERIALS

Keeping with our use of marble, wood, stainless steel, classic deep red and hints of black.

**3.4.2 Interior Finishes** (d) Interior finishes should not attempt to imitate any other material. For example, laminates in colors or patterns not replicating other materials are acceptable; those mimicking wood or stone are not acceptable.





# 1 New Cases

Cases needed replacement as previous refrigerated cases were failing.

#### **UPDATE INCLUDES**

- Criocabin brand with remote refrigeration
- Made in Italy for a guaranteed European feel
- More prominent display of pastry
- Lower case profile allows for better customer interaction
- 3 cases (2 refrigerated) instead of 4 (2 refrigerated)
- Wood panels with glass & stainless accents

**3.4.3 Displays** (a) The display of goods themselves should be the dominant element with minimization of shelving, cases, and other display supports. The use of excessive decoration, signage or artificial effects is discouraged.






# 2 Cabinetry

Cabinetry updates to accommodate new cases, improve employee workflow, open up the view to our production area and show more freshly baked goods on racks.


#### **UPDATE INCLUDES**

- Beech wood stained 'Nutella' balances a French feel while feeling familiar
- Fluting on cabinetry reminiscent of wainscoting but easier to maintain



Before: Red tones with simple shaker lines. Significant repairs needed in various places



After: Using warm browns and keeping simplicity of line and coordinating with case fronts



Before: Floating bread wall served as backdrop for pastry case but blocked view into production area



After: Shifting the bread wall over opened up view into production area (see next slide)

### Bread Wall

- Opens up view to production area to emphasize 'scratch-bakery' (see images on next slide)
- Made of solid wood for easier maintenance, matching the new cabinetry
- Proportions are same as previous bread wall
- Reuse of original metal bread racks





Before: Bread wall blocks view to production area, only oven is visible






After: Full racks roll into updated built-in

### Croissant Rack Slots


- Showing more behind the scenes, we designed this cabinet to accommodate full racks of croissant which saves time for both bakers and sales staff during our busy season
- Pre-existing aluminum rolling racks roll right in to the cabinetry
- We moved the previous hand sink just behind this wall
- Added packaging storage for easier access







Before: POS had just over 12" of space for customer plates, boxes, bags etc.




After: Expanded customer counter makes ringing up large orders much easier

### 2 | CABINETRY Point of Sale

- Similar layout, material use and function as the previous cabinet
- Slightly expanded customer counter
- Increased functionality when serving freshly brewed coffee
- Tip jar hole/drawer prevents theft








After: Employee moves parallel with customer and serves drip coffee without disturbing barista

Before: Employees turned away from customer to get drip coffee and often bumped working barista





Before: Great functionality, we knew we wanted to keep

After: New drawer fronts to match new stain, reusing same handles


### Drawers

- Keep drawers but replace drawer fronts and make repairs where needed
- Reuse of previous drawer handles






Before: Espresso machine is customers final stop but with full view into sink and bus bins



After: Nicer view for our customers while waiting for their coffee

### Espresso Bar

- New placement shifted to account for pastry display and new cases
- French-inspired fluting is reminiscent of wainscoting
- Curved bar allows for better customer traffic flow
- Barista working area is more efficient
- Improved view from the street (vs. straight into dishwasher / sink)
- New hand sink added to follow Health Department Guidelines





Before: Stairs at both entrance and exit had railings etc. but proved to be a chaotic

After: Beautiful entry and a smooth transition to handrails for ramp

## Entry Cabinet


- To create a more gracious entrance
- To accommodate both the new ramp railing and relocated bus station wall surround
- Adds a chance for seasonal delight with fresh flowers and the daily newspapers.
- Use of marble and wood creates cohesion









### Waste Station

- New location for easy dish drop for customers on their way out
- Baguette tile surround for easy cleaning
- New stainless bin with clear labels

## Self-Service Water


- Improved placement for easier access by all customers
- Minimal cabinet pulls

Before: Not in the normal pathway of customers grabbing coffee to go, they had to backtrack a bit

- More central placement for easy access after picking up coffee or baked goods
- Central between each seating area

3 Countertops

#### **UPDATE INCLUDES**

Keeping our material use of stainless and marble for our countertops.

## Stainless Steel

- Similar to previous, the use of stainless steel at espresso area is vital
- 16 gauge
- We chose to extend the use to the dish sink as well for durability









Before: Espresso bar had stainless steel but dish area was marble which was not durable enough for this use



After: Stainless extended to dish area for easy cleanup and longevity

## 3 | COUNTERTOPS

### Marble

- Creamy with hints of brown and warm tones, replaced previous marble because of significant wear and tear
- Use of marble keeps the French feel
- New accents added at front entry as well as a new waterfall design element between the two display cases


# 4 Ramp & Railings


Not many people knew we were ADA accessible through our back door. We wanted to make it easier for those who can't maneuver stairs.


Upon completion we found a surprise result. People now have time to look as they come down the ramp and not just "be in line." The welcome and view for our customer is significantly better.

Dimensions and railings follow Commercial Ramp Code (see next slide).


#### **RAMP DIMENSIONS**


- Wall to Wall: 4' 10" (58") Code requires: 48" min
- Between Railings: 4' 2" (50")
- Railing Width: 2" *Code Requires: 1 1/4" - 2"*
- **Slope:** 7.2% (Rise: 1' 2 5/8" Run: 16' 9 1/16")

Code requires: 8.5% slope max

• Landing: 80+ inches of level floor available

Code requires: 60"




#### **RAILING DIMENSIONS**

#### • Railing Width: 2"

*Code Requires: 1 1/4" - 2"* 

- All ends turn 90° to end in wall.
- Railing Distance from Wall: 2" Code Requires: 1 1/2" min



5 Customer Seating

With the addition of the ramp, we needed a new solution for our center seating area. We opted for a bench seat, as well as new ADA seating while leaving the front window seating as is.


#### **UPDATE INCLUDES**

- Same amount of seats (approx. 15+)
- New French marble tables with copper edges made in Nantes, FR
- New bench seating made using previous table top as the seat
- ADA seating added
- Front window seating remains the same




MARBLE TABLES WITH COPPER EDGE & BLACK BASE ARDAMEZ





Before: Wood topped tables with black steel bases




After: Marble topped tables, copper accent with black steel bases add to French feel

### **5 | CUSTOMER SEATING** Bench


- Creates a divider between ramp and seating
- Re-purposed table top as bench seat
- With bar-height seating, we added a foot-rest on the bench for comfort
- See dimensions on following page
- Flexible sit/stand option so groups can use the area and bench as they like
- Bolt-down marble tables
- Round Table: 23.6" D x 27.95" H



### Bench, cont.

• Foot rest is 18" below seat, 8" from lower bench wall and runs full length of the bench (about 12')

### **5 | CUSTOMER SEATING** ADA Seating

- New table and move-able chairs for ADA seating where we didn't have any before
- Table: 23.6" D x 27.9" H
- About 5% of seating is ADA (15+ seats total, 2+ of those seats are ADA)
- Classic Thonet bentwood chairs


- Remains the same with original wood top and metal base
- Fleur de lis accent remains

# 6 Retail Floor

The original floor is no longer produced and was worn through to concrete below in some spots. We opted to seal the old asbestos tile (VAT) with a membrane and apply striped concrete tile, inspired by our original floors and French awnings. This update only applies to retail area floor.

#### **UPDATE INCLUDES**

- Cement Tile in Beige and Cinnamon
- Original VAT tile remains in production area and we are using the updated VCT to patch
- New stair tread schluter with non-slip grip built in as additional safety feature on the stairs (see next slide)




Before: Significant wear and tear throughout the retail area

**3.4.2 Interior Finishes** c) Floor coverings should be utilitarian and easily cleaned. For example, wood, ceramic tile, linoleum, vinyl, concrete and asphalt composition materials are acceptable.

**3.2.11** Floors in public areas should have continuity of material and color.





# 7 Paint & Walls

Aiming for a light and bright yet warm interior, we went for cream walls while keeping our classic deep red. We decided to remove the wainscoting for practical reasons.

#### **UPDATE INCLUDES**


- Cream walls to keep warmth
- Using classic deep red at the front windows - extending it from the doors
- Wainscoting removed due to upkeep & the need for rodent prevention barriers





# 8 Lighting

#### **UPDATE INCLUDES**

- Classic original shades used keeping with historic use also seen throughout the market
- We had them cleaned up and powder coated for durability
- Updated bulbs from fluorescent to warm LED's with similar warmth of Incandescent bulbs
- New bulbs are: 2700K | 1100 Lumens

**3.5 Lighting | 3.5.1** Incandescent lighting has been traditionally used in the Market, and reinforces the historically warm qualities of the buildings. (...) New lighting designs should approximate the warmth and quality of historical lighting in the Market.




