# HISTORY

## OCCIDENTAL SQUARE

- In 1974, Occidental Park hosted its first ever LGBTQ+ picnic to mark the significant five-year anniversary of Stonewall, and approximately 200 people showed up.
- Well into the late 70's, Occidental Square was safe place for LGBTQ+ folks to come celebrate and protest the right to be free.
- DSA/MID wants to amplify the role the LGBTQ+ communities have had in the space and in Pioneer Square neighborhood through this installation.
- We have partnered with Revel Haus on design, creation, and execute the installation.
