

Pioneer Square Park

Potential mitigation measures to accompany future park development. This list is in no particular order. It is assumed that project stakeholders, especially the Tribes, will have extensive opportunities to contribute to these mitigation measures and review and comment on the deliverables prior to public release.

Interpretation - Analog

Installation of one (1) analog interpretive display panel about the Project Area/Property adversely impacted by the proposed project. The analog interpretive display panel will include written information on the precontact and postcontact history of the Project Area/Property. The analog interpretive display panel will also include both historic and recent photos documenting the appearance of the Project Area/Property. The completed analog interpretive display panel will be installed within the Project Area/Property. The Project Proponent will give the Department of Archaeology and Historic Preservation (DAHP) (and other consulting parties to the mitigation agreement, if applicable) the opportunity to review the draft analog interpretive display panel content and the comments from DAHP (and consulting parties, if applicable) will be incorporated prior to installation.

Interpretation - Analog

Publish updates to one (1) of the following media:

- Book: Pioneer Square: Seattle's Oldest Neighborhood, by Mildred T. Andrews, editor, et al., originally published in 2005.
- Book: Seattle's Pioneer Square (Images of America), by Joy Keniston-Longrie and Wes Uhlman, originally published in 2009.

Interpretation - Digital

Publish updates to one (1) of the following media:

- HistoryLink.org article: "Seattle Neighborhoods: Pioneer Square – Thumbnail History", originally published in June 2001 and last revised in May 2004.

Interpretation - Digital

Production of an ArcGIS StoryMap about the Project Area/Property adversely impacted by the proposed project. The StoryMap will include maps and written statements about the precontact and postcontact history of the Project Area/Property, combined with audio, film, and/or video. The completed StoryMap will be posted publicly and supported by Project Proponent (or their designated agent, e.g., City of Seattle, etc.) for two (2) years following its completion. The Project Proponent will give the Department of Archaeology and Historic Preservation (DAHP) (and other consulting parties to the mitigation agreement, if applicable) the opportunity to review the draft StoryMap and the comments

from DAHP (and consulting parties, if applicable) will be incorporated prior to public posting.

Historic Built Environment (HBE) Survey

The Project Proponent shall engage a consultant to complete an intensive level survey (ILS) of [INSERT NAME AND LOCATION OF PROPERTY HERE]. The consultant shall meet the Secretary of Interior's Professional Qualifications Standards for Architectural History, Historic Architecture, and/or History. The results of the ILS shall be documented with an Historic Property Inventory (HPI) form uploaded to the DAHP Washington Information System for Architectural and Archeological Records Data (WISAARD) digital repository. The Project Proponent will give the Department of Archaeology and Historic Preservation (DAHP) the opportunity to review the draft HPI form and the DAHP comments will be incorporated prior to finalization of the ILS documentation.

Documentation

The Project Proponent shall engage a consultant to prepare a context statement on the history of Jones and Jones, the architectural and landscape architectural firm which designed the early 1970s Pioneer Park alterations. The consultant shall meet the Secretary of Interior's Professional Qualifications Standards for Architectural History, Historic Architecture, and/or History. Whenever possible, this historic context statement should reference primary sources, such as archival material, correspondence, oral histories, etc., in addition to books, newspapers, and other secondary sources. The Project Proponent will give DAHP the opportunity to review a draft of the historic context statement and the DAHP comments will be incorporated prior to its publication.
