






# Events Overview

- Seattle Center hosts over 14,000 events and attracts over 10 million visitors each year
- Prominent events are held regularly at Exhibition Hall, Founders Court, and Theatre Commons
- Examples of events in this space include:
  - Seattle/King County Clinic
  - Graduations
  - Northwest Folklife Festival
  - Seattle Marathon
  - DeafNation Expo
  - National Robotics Invitational
  - Eidul-Adha Prayer

# Temporary Signage Conditions

- All signage will remain in place for no more than 60 days
- Temporary art may remain in place longer than 60 days, but no more than 12 months
- All art and signage can be installed and removed without damage to the designated features
- Proposed uses of existing colonnade hardware to support temporary art and signage may apply to various locations at both the North and South Colonnade
- Signage/art installed using brackets or eye hooks will make use of pre-existing, already installed hardware at fixed locations. This plan does not propose installing any additional eye hooks or brackets to the structure.
- Movable, freestanding signage may be displayed at various locations around the site without mechanical attachments









**Condition 1:** Temporary art installation rigged using existing column brackets






**Condition 1, continued:** Temporary art installation rigged using existing column brackets






**Condition 2:** Temporary art installation constructed around column




**Condition 3:** Temporary art installation attached to brackets and tied around column





**Condition 4:** Decorative element hung from rigging attached to column brackets






**Condition 5:** Decorative bunting tied to/wrapped around columns


**Condition 6:** Banner hung from wire rigging attached via rigging sling




**Condition 7:** Banners hung from wire rigging attached to column brackets


**Condition 8:** Flexible graphic sheeting secured around columns with clamps (no adhesive)






**Condition 9:** Banner hung from wire rigging attached to existing brackets/eye hooks





**Condition 10:** Vinyl banners attached to balustrade hand railing












**Condition 13:** Vinyl banners attached to existing grid of eye hooks






**Condition 14:** Vinyl banners attached to existing wall brackets and wiring on south façade of fly loft






**Condition 15:** Temporary decorative elements hung from wire rigging attached to existing eye hook






**Condition 16:** Decorative elements strung from non-original sheltered walkway


**Condition 17:** Decorative bunting attached to overhead beams of non-original sheltered walkway






**Condition 18:** Windmaster-style freestanding signage






**Condition 19:** Freestanding metal trusses in Theater Commons requiring no mechanical attachments






**Condition 20:** Freestanding inflatable arch in Theater Commons requiring no mechanical attachments






**Condition 21:** Three existing sets of eye hooks for temporary signage and art



# Temporary Lighting Conditions

- Lighting will remain in place for the duration of events, up to a maximum of 6 months.
- Lighting equipment can be removed without changing the building or site and without requiring repair.
- Possible lighting conditions include:
  - Theatrical lights on roof of colonnade focused on surrounding plaza grounds
  - Lighting in trees, shrubs, and planters on the site
