- Scope of work is to place power and communications lines on 18th Avenue between Jefferson & Cherry underground
- The SIP covers capital improvements mandated in the Conditions of the MIMP. Details

 Worksheet, Item #9.
- Trailers will be delivered to the site when there is a firm start date. They will be placed along the east side of 18th Avenue in front of the houses to the north of the Hope Heart building.
- UMP Mylars have been submitted to SDOT. Permit should be issued shortly.
- SIP SDOT has requested Bond, Work Zone Plan and Traffic Control Plan. These are being assembled and will be delivered to SDOT. In the next few weeks.
