- Seattle City Council bumped the budget timeline back one week to address the November revenue forecast
- Francesca will continue to share regular updates on the budget process and potential impacts to Indigenous communities

- Many pathways to developing a work plan and many local resources and relationships to inform the work; Slides include several local tribal and urban Native community assessments and reports that may inform a work plan

Review and discuss next steps for Projects of Interest

- Councilmember Mills debriefed a recent meeting with the Office of Sustainability and Environment (OSE), Department of Neighborhoods (DON), and Office of Intergovernmental Relations (OIR) regarding the <u>Food Action</u> <u>Plan</u> update; Meeting goals included relationship building and strengthening tribal partnerships through the Food Action Plan update and across OSE initiatives
- Members identified several projects of interest to begin relationship building
 with City departments and community groups; Projects included the Seattle
 City Light Climate Adaptation and Resilience Plan; slapilabaxw Rising Tides
 Indigenous Planning Group & the Native Neighborhoods Community Study;
 MMIP Data Reforms; and the More Than A Land Acknowledgment campaign
