Topic

Providing Medical Aid

Summary

 It was alleged that officers failed to provide medical assistance to arrestees who were pepper sprayed.

Analysis

- Officers working a demonstration observed individuals within a group damage property. Bicycle
 officers attempted to make a targeted arrest of a subject in the group. Other protesters physically
 interfered with the arrest, and an officer deployed pepper spray at two individuals, who were
 ultimately arrested.
- None of the officers on scene made an effort to rinse the eyes of the two protesters who were pepper sprayed, nor were officers equipped with supplies to decontaminate the arrestees' eyes.
- SPD Policy 8.300-POL-4 #7 (previously 8.300-POL-5 #9) instructs that "officers shall assist exposed subjects with decontamination and medical aid, as soon as reasonably possible." The policy does not explain what decontamination measures officers should take beyond moving the subject into fresh air.

Recommendation(s)

- Revise SPD policy 8.300-POL-4 to define what it means to decontaminate individuals affected by OC spray, and instruct officers to assist in decontaminating subjects' eyes when requested.
- Assign at least one bicycle officer in each squad (perhaps a supervisor) to carry a sterile saline solution that can be used to rinse individuals' eyes.
