Topic

• Vehicle Arrest Scenarios

Summary

• It was alleged that officers did not communicate or plan the extraction of a burglary suspect from a vehicle attempting to flee.

Analysis

- Officers responded to an in-progress burglary and found the subject running toward and starting a vehicle. The officers quickly engaged the subject to stop him from leaving. During the struggle with the subject, one officer used his flashlight and knee, and a second officer used his fist, to strike the subject and generate compliance. A third officer arrived and delivered a knee strike to the subject, at which point the officers collectively took the subject into custody.
- OPA has concerns with the officers' tactics and decision-making. Officers ran toward the vehicle to extract the subject without planning or communication with each other, leading to a dangerous and volatile situation. OPA has seen a number of recent cases in which officers engage and extract subjects from vehicles with little communication, resulting in significant uses of force.

Recommendation(s)

• Develop scenario-based training on detaining subjects in and around vehicles. Incorporate instruction on team tactics and decision making, de-escalation, removing subjects from vehicles, appropriate levels of force, and specific dangers and risks.
