*"Institutionalized population" includes people under formally authorized, supervised care or custody.

Example settings include: nursing homes, mental hospitals, hospitals or wards for the chronically ill, correctional institutions, juvenile institutions, etc.

**"Noninstitutionalized population" includes people who live in group quarters other than institutions. Staff residing in military and nonmilitary group quarters on institutional grounds are included here.

Example settings include: college dormitories and college quarters off campus, military quarters, group homes, religious group quarters, crews of maritime vessels, shelters, soup kitchens, etc.
