Supplemental Tables of CHAS 2015-2019 5-Year Estimates for Seattle

CHAS data are special tabulations that the federal Departmental of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) obtains from the Census Bureau's American Community Survey (ACS). HUD publishes the CHAS (Comprehensive Housing Affordability Strategy) data on its website to help local communities analyze housing needs, supply, and gaps—especially for low-income households. Seattle used CHAS data as one of the key sources for the analyses in the draft One Seattle Plan Housing Appendix.

As a companion to the draft Housing Appendix, this document contains supplemental tables to provide readers the opportunity to examine the CHAS data in more detail. It is important for users of these data to be aware that the CHAS estimates carry margins of error and may be unreliable for small groups of households. Another aspect to be aware of is that CHAS data provide a broad picture of a community's housing needs and supply and do not distinguish between subsidized housing and market-provided housing. There is also a significant lag between data collection and publication of CHAS data; the 2019 5-year CHAS estimates presented here were the most recent available at the time of our analysis.
