• **Purpose/Goal:** The Native and Tribal Led Climate Initiative seeks to advance the City of Seattle and Seattle Foundation's priorities to invest in Native American and Tribal climate leadership and resource traditional and cultural knowledge. We also strive to build partnerships with Native leaders to deploy climate strategies that are unique to the needs of Native American communities and fulfill the City's cultural and resource preservation commitments.

• **Vision:** Seattle Foundation and The City of Seattle's Office of Sustainability and Environment envision a community focused process that includes the voices of Tribes and Native leaders who live and work across the city. We hope to support existing projects, technical assistance, and a variety of climate strategies that center native communities and leadership.



# We are prioritizing projects that build on existing work and include, but are not limited to, the following priorities:

### Please send your recommendations for possible projects by 8/22

- Investing in Tribal and Native American climate leadership
- Resourcing traditional and cultural knowledge
- Deploying climate strategies unique to the needs of Indigenous communities
- Centering strategies that mitigate environmental injustices
- Supporting the low-carbon economy for Native peoples
- Centering resilience, safety and community wellbeing
- Creating infrastructure or strategies that reduce, mitigate, or eliminate environmental health inequities in Native communities





- Open to Tribal governments, non-profits, and fiscally sponsored groups
- Invitation to apply
- Grants range from \$500K to \$1 million over two years.




# **Board Buddies**

### **City Budget Basics**

Mayor proposes an annual budget, Council amends and passes




- Budget governs appropriation levels for all City spending
- Available City resources are based on economic forecasts
  - Projected City revenue dictates the amount that can be budgeted
  - City is legally required to balance budget.






### **Typical Budget Process Timeline**



 The Proposed Budget is developed by the City Budget Office and the Mayor's Office between June and September, based on economic and revenue forecasts, department-proposed changes, and mayoral priorities.

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### **Revenue Update**

- Major revenue sources for the General Fund include Property Tax, Sales and Use Tax, and taxes on the Utilities.
