ABOUT THE GREEN NEW DEAL OVERSIGHT BOARD

The City is seeking passionate individuals to serve on the Green New Deal Oversight Board to provide budget, policy, programmatic, and project recommendations to advance Seattle's Green New Deal and collaborate on climate solutions that promote justice and equity for frontline communities who are most affected by the climate crisis.

The Board is seeking members for the following 3-year term seats:

- Tribal Representative (seat filled through consultation with Tribes)
- Labor Representatives
- Workforce Training Representative
- Environmental Justice Organization Representatives
- Emissions Reduction Representative with experience in greenhouse gas reduction and/or climate resiliency strategies relevant to cities.

TIME COMMITMENT

GND Oversight Board members are expected to spend **6-8 hours a month on Board activities**, such as:

- Attending evening meetings every 3rd Monday of the month.
- Preparing for monthly meetings.
- Participating in Board related events.
- Participating in an optional Subcommittee.
- Participating in annual Board retreat.

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Contribute to the development and implementation of the GND Oversight Board workplan.
- Identify policy and program opportunities that advance Seattle's Green New Deal.
- Provide recommendations on planning and implementation of City actions to make Seattle climate pollution free.
- Provide recommendations on City budget and legislative actions that advance Seattle's Green New Deal.
- Build relationships and engage with community partners, City departments, and existing Committees, Boards, and Commissions.

DESIRED QUALIFICATIONS

- Experience with and/or an understanding of racial, economic, and environmental injustice.
- A desire to build relationships and collaborate with government partners.
- Ability to provide community-guided suggestions on climate-related challenges.
- A commitment to working to eliminate inequities.
- An understanding of the connection between climate issues, racial equity and access to resources.
- Experience with community collaboration, coalition building, and engagement.
- Experience working on community climate resilience/sustainability.
