The Green New Deal Oversight Board is made up of diverse community representatives who recommend policies and programs that advance Seattle's Green New Deal and develop recommendations to bring benefits to communities on the frontlines of the climate crisis. The Board connects community-led voices and City government to reduce Seattle's climate pollution, while resolving racial, social, and economic inequities to maximize the benefits of climate action.

MEET THE BOARD

- Established through Seattle's Green New Deal Ordinance in 2019.
- The Board is made up of 19 appointed members by the Mayor, City Council, and the Board:
 - community representatives,
 - including 2 Tribal representatives and 2 youth representatives
 - 4 labor union representatives
 - environmental justice organization representatives
 - 3 representatives who specialize in reducing pollution
 - specialist in workforce training

BOARD CONTRIBUTIONS

- Provided recommendations for equity provisions in the newly passed Building Emissions Performance Standard legislation
- Collaborated with frontline community members and workers to identify solutions to the climate crisis through community assemblies.
- Recommended yearly multi-million dollar investments to the Mayor and City Council focused on climate resilience, workforce development, and electrification projects since 2022


