2021 Financial Interest Statements (Due no later than April 18, 2022): Ms. Scheele reminded the commission that the Financial Interest Statements for 2021 are due no later than April 18.

7. POLICE SERGEANT PROMOTIONAL EXAM PROTEST APPEALS

The commission considered appeals on exam protest of two questions on the Police Sergeant promotional exam, held March 5, 2022. The candidate was not present at the meeting. The two exam questions were reviewed and discussed by the commission. Rachael Schade, Police Exams Administrator, and Police Lieutenants Tony Gaedcke and Tyrone Davis were present on behalf of the development committee. The remedy requested was removal of the questions from the exam. Later in the meeting, the commissioners held an executive session to deliberate.

DISCUSSION ITEMS

8. FIRE AND POLICE EXAM UNIT

Fire and Police Updates-Yoshiko Grace Matsui, Fire Exams Analyst & Rachael Schade, Police Exams Analyst:

- **Fire Update:** Ms. Grace Matsui reported that written exams for the Fire Battalion Chief and Fire Captain will take place on Friday April 1. Development for the oral board components of the Fire Captain and Battalion Chief are underway. Bibliographies are being finalized for the written exam for Fireboat Pilot. The off-cycle entry level exam for Firefighter is in progress and will run for a few more weeks. The response rate has been very good for an off-cycle exam, and approximately 2000 candidates have applied so far.
- **Police Update:** Ms. Schade reported that the entry-level Police officer exam window closed on March 18. Pass/fail letters were sent to candidates March 25. There were 480 candidates, 209 who completed the exam, 140 passed and were placed on the register. The Sergeant written exam is in progress, scored and invites to oral board assessments will go out.

9. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REPORT

Departmental Work and Budget Update: Budget to Actuals (B2A): The commission reviewed the Budget to Actuals report. Ms. Scheele stated the B2A does not yet reflect allocation of funds for Legal Advice. **Fire and Police Exams:** Ms. Scheele recognized the Exams Unit for their outstanding work on developing and administering Police and Fire exams. **Civil Service Commission** Ms. Scheele announced the Council position that was held by Angelique Davis will be filled by the appointment of Evan Chinn formerly of the Department of Construction and Inspection. Commissioner Chinn will begin his term in April. Staff continues to work with the City Clerk's office to hold a Special Election for the employee elected position that was held by Commissioner Bonfrisco. Voting will open on April 25 for all city employees in the civil service. **Budget:** Ms. Scheele reported she continues to work with the Commission's budget analyst to ensure the commission remains appropriately funded to carry out its work. **Community Service Preference Points:** Ms. Scheele reported she is working on the draft rule that will bring the City into compliance with the 2017 Police Accountability Ordinance. **Open Public Meetings:**

The proclamation restricting open public meetings will be suspended at some unknown point in the future. Civ is preparing for return to in-person meetings. Commissioners may attend in person or under the rules commissioners may continue to attend remotely.

10. CASE STATUS REPORT

The commission reviewed the Case Status Report.

- *Young v. SFD*, PSCSC No. 22-01-001APS-New Appeal: The appeal filed by Officer Young was dismissed by the Executive Director for lack of subject matter jurisdiction and referred to Seattle Office for Civil Rights for investigation of discrimination allegations.

11. EXECUTIVE SESSION: The commission went into Executive Session at 10:50. The Executive Session ended at 11:10. After executive session, the PSCSC voted as follows:

Police Sergeant Promotional Exam Protest Appeals

- **PSCSC No. 22-04-012Ex, (Q #58):** The appellants remedy to eliminate the question was denied by a unanimous vote of the commission.
- **PSCSC No. 22-04-013Ex, (Q # 66):** The appellants remedy to eliminate the question was denied by a vote of 2 with 1 abstention.

12. OLD/NEW BUSINESS: There was no Old/New Business

13. ADJOURN: All other business before the Commission having been considered, Commission Chair Connoles adjourned the meeting at 11:13 a.m.

The purpose of this confidential memo is to provide background information about how the written exam questions were developed, what bibliography information they are based upon, and the protest process that has led up to the hearing on appeals scheduled to occur on April 19, 2022, at 9:00 a.m. As the Fire Exams Administrator, I am a subject matter expert on the exam, and I am authorized to speak on behalf of the development committee. Please feel free to ask me any exam or appeal related questions. I respectfully remind the Commission that all exam materials contained herein are confidential and should not be shared or disseminated to anyone.

Background on Test Development

The 2022 Fire Captain Exam Development Committee is comprised of seven subject matter experts: an exam consultant from Testing for Public Safety, one Battalion Chief who is the Chair of the Promotional Development Committees, three SFD Fire Captains, and Fire & Police Exams Administrators Yoshiko Grace Matsui and Adelaide Alderks. Over the course of approximately seven months the committee held many meetings to develop, edit, and complete the written exam.

Source Materials for the Written Exam

All written exam questions were developed to assess each candidate's knowledge, skills, and abilities to perform the job for which they are seeking promotion. The written exam questions must be directly sourced from the exam bibliography. The exam bibliography was published to the Department on December 30, 2021. The Exam Development Committee approves all materials for the bibliography and reviews each question considered for inclusion in the written exam. The questions themselves are developed by a vendor, Testing for Public Safety. This vendor has 25+ years of experience in developing and validating exams for Police and Fire Departments in the U.S. The vendor works with the remainder of the development committee to appropriately edit developed questions.

Protest/Appeal Process

The written exam was administered on April 1, 2022. There were 40 Lieutenants who participated in the exam. The three-day protest period was held April 4 - 6, 2022, where candidates were allowed to review the exam booklet along with the exam key, and to file any protests to exam scope, content, and practicality in compliance with Rule 9.22 – KEY COPY INSPECTION AND EXAMINATION PROTEST. There were 26 protests filed on 23 different written exam questions. The Development Committee met on April 8, 2022 and reviewed all of the protests. Seven protests were approved and 16 were denied. All Fire Captain candidates were sent a memo outlining the decisions on protest and the Appeals process. (See APPENDIX A – PROTEST MEMO).

One candidate filed timely Appeals on four questions, #4, #47, #187, #205. (See APPENDIX B – CANDIDATE APPEALS).



TACTICAL CONSIDERATION 01

Interior Attack – Smoke Showing



If the intent is to move the products of combustion ahead of their position, the crew should consistently move the nozzle in a pattern.

The faster the nozzle is moved, the more it will move products ahead of the crew.



With all else being equal, the tactical choice on where to apply water from should be based more on the time it takes to knock back the fire, and less on the place the water is being applied from.

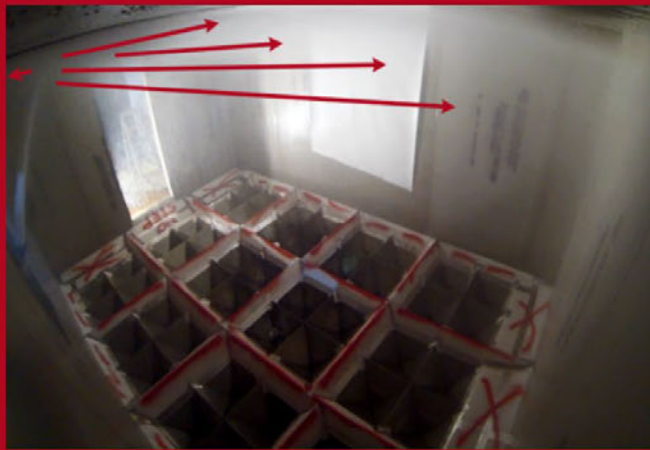

TACTICAL CONSIDERATION 01

Interior Attack – Smoke Showing



Applying a steep angle stream off the ceiling will coat the most surfaces in the room, providing the most cooling.

After applying water at a steep angle, the stream should be transitioned down to apply water to the contents in the room.
