

Clean Cities Community Clean Teams Weekly Report

September 9, 2021

Reporting Week August 30 through September 5

Week in Review

This week the community clean team focused on two large emphasis areas, Kobe Terrance Park and Georgetown Playfield as well as the various litter and trash pick-up locations citywide. The following summary includes Clean Cities work accomplished by Parks/SDOT Clean Cities Crews.

By the Numbers:

- Trash mitigation completed at 35 locations by Parks/SDOT crews, and 10 addition locations by SDOT crews
- 810 needles collected by Parks Crews
- 68,450 lbs. trash collected via Community Clean Teams
- 14 blocks of litter pickup by SDOT crews
- 2 miles of vegetation management
- 361 tents counted onsite

Clean Cities Emphasis Areas

• Kobe Terrance Park: 8/31. Downtown District's Clean City Project addressed continue deferred maintenance removing bamboo, weeds, and overgrown vegetation. The crew line trimmed weeds along staircases, in shrub beds and around benches and a section was hedge trimmed near the volunteer garden. Burlap was laid and mulch spread. Trees were limbed for better site lines throughout the park.

• Georgetown PF: 9/2. SC District's Clean City Project was held at Georgetown PF. The crew removed overgrown blackberries from the eastside fence line by line trimming and using loppers. A Grandstand mower was used to cut up the blackberry cuttings. 1 tent counted in the park in the same location as work being performed.

Emphasis Cleans:

NE: I-5 North Bound Off Ramp @ Ravenna (Soundwall) - WSDOT

SW: Duwamish Trail & 8th AVE SE: Melrose & Olive - WSDOT

The Crews will be doing litter picks, trash mitigation; any Bio- Hazard removal that may be required, and related grounds maintenance work. Crews will also be providing maintenance and cleaning efforts both in and around these parks. Field inspections and cleaning of right of way areas will include stairways, multi-use paths, streets, and sidewalks in the immediate vicinity of these parks.
