


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## **Green Lake Community Center & Pool Background**


- Green Lake CC was constructed in two phases; the two-story field house with the gym and pottery studio was constructed in 1930; Evans Pool and new entry lobby was added in 1955.
- It is one of the oldest community centers in our system and totals approx. 26,000 sq. ft.
- The Evans Pool building is a City landmark – demolition requires approval from the City's Landmarks Preservation Board.






## Green Lake Community Center & Pool Redevelopment Process


- RFQ issued in 2019 Miller Hull hired
- Public process started in 2020 with survey regarding uses and potential alternate sites for the CC – 75% of respondents preferred the existing location (3,200+ responses)
- Initial redevelopment schemes were \$77M+ (2020\$, 92K sq. ft.); 2021 VE exercise reduced construction costs to \$58+M, 46,000 sq. ft.
- Considered the possibility of just renovating existing structure to bring it up to current code requirement = \$30-35M
- 2023 project restarted with \$59M budget, \$3M in hand for design, remaining \$56M through bonding. \$59M total cost = \$35M construction plus soft costs and contingencies. Design team working on schemes with \$35M target construction cost – design will progress to 60%; project could be phased moving beyond 60% based on estimated costs and funding
- Outstanding issue with Landmarks Preservation Board related to the Evans Pool building





## **Green Lake Community Center & Pool Next Steps**

- Meet with Landmarks Preservation Board to get approval related to partial demolition of pool building
- Restart public outreach
  - Project timeline
  - Phased approach based on available budget
- Seek grant funding
  - King County Aquatics Grant
- Procurement via Alternative Delivery Mechanism
  - Design/bid/build
  - General contractor Construction/construction manager
  - Design build





Redevelopment of community center site with a new community center w/4-5 stories of affordable housing units above. Project to be developed in partnership with Seattle Office of Housing





- Unique site and opportunity to add housing as a pilot partnership with the Office of Housing – context is similar to the International District/ Chinatown CC
- Existing community Center demolished in early 2024 due to arson fire
- SPR w/Broadview Planning leading a community needs assessment to inform the development teams. Community survey closing on August 9.
- Office of Housing issued RFQ to prequalify developers for the project on April 12, 2024. Three developers have been prequalified:
  - Bridge Housing
  - Mercy Housing
  - Low Income Housing Institute (LIHI)
- Office of Housing issues RFP on July 29, 2024
