

DETERMINATION OF NON-SIGNIFICANCE

Description: **Burke Gilman Playground Park Improvements** – Seattle Parks and Recreation is proposing to renovate the east portion of the Burke Gilman Playground Park. The site will be regraded to provide universal accessibility throughout. The existing comfort station will be renovated to provide a new community room and three (3) ADA compliant restroom stalls with adult changing tables. The park improvements consist of new play equipment, planting, stormwater bioretention facilities, art, signage, pedestrian lighting, a picnic shelter, and an overlook. The project includes approximately 4,500 cu.yds. of grading.


There is no comment period for this DNS.
