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Cheasty Mountain Bike Trail Monitoring Baseline Summary Report

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1. Introduction

Seattle Parks and Recreation contracted with EarthCorps in 2020 to develop and implement a monitoring plan prior to the construction associated with phase one of the South Loop Cheasty Mountain Bike/Pedestrian Trail Pilot Project at the Cheasty Natural Area in South Seattle. The proposed monitoring plan was intended to track general changes to the vegetation as a direct result of trail construction throughout the 3-year pilot project timeline. **Four** vegetation monitoring plots were established prior to trail construction in order to obtain representative baseline vegetation structure and composition data. South Loop monitoring will continue through the end of 2025.


In 2024, SPR contracted with EarthCorps to extend this monitoring plan into the North Loop section associated with phase two of the Cheasty Mountain Bike/Pedestrian Trail Pilot Project. Four monitoring plots were established prior to and during trail construction to obtain baseline vegetation structure and composition data. The following report summarizes the results of the Q1 2025 photo monitoring of the North Loop monitoring plots. Photos were taken in March of 2025 to cover first quarter (Jan-Mar) of 2025.

The following report provides photo monitoring results taken in Q1 (March 21, 2025). See map 1 for locations of monitoring plots. The Appendices include photo monitoring for this period.

The following table describes the proposed monitoring year designations for this three-year reporting period for the North Loop trail:

Year 1 Baseline/Trail construction:	2024
Year 2 monitoring:	2025
Year 3 monitoring:	2026

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2. Plot Data Summary

The following trail and vegetation conditions were observed during the photo monitoring visit. Major changes were noted in Plot 1 (habitat maintenance) and Plot 3 (trail rerouting).

Plot 1: No trail construction is planned or occurring in this plot (control plot). Substantial habitat restoration and vegetation management has taken place since the previous monitoring period. Clearing of previously dominant invasive plant species has resulted in moderate exposure of bare ground (approximately 15% of total plot excluding trail surface). Cherry laurel has been removed, sycamore maple sprouts noted (hard to quantify leaf-off). Common blackberry and ivy sprouts noted regenerating throughout plot, follow up stewardship recommended. Limited native tree planting was noted in the plot including Douglas fir, grand fir, western red cedar, and wester hemlock. Natural regeneration of several native herbaceous species noted including fringcups, large-leaved avens, and bracken fern.

Plot 2: No substantial changes to trail or vegetation noted from previous monitoring period. Substantial bare ground remains present from ongoing trail construction in vicinity. Trail tread has been leveled and smoothed from previous monitoring period but still under substantial construction. Limited planting noted in plot area including sword fern, fringcups, youth-on-age, and lupine. Very limited tree planting noted with single individual Douglas fir and Sitka spruce trees noted. Some natural native herbaceous regeneration noted including ciliate willow-herb and fringcups.

Plot 3: The trail has been rerouted from the original flag line and is now routed through the west side of the plot. As a result, substantial alteration of the topography has taken place to facilitate the construction of a bridge over the creek. Considerable bare ground was noted within the original plot area (>50% cover). Mature holly and cherry laurel trees remain present. Some native bigleaf maple trees were marked to remove dead branches or fully dead trees (as noted by SPR arborists) for the safety of trail users. Small amounts of blackberry and ivy present. Some limited amounts of snowberry were noted planted in the plot. Some drainage issues were noted up trail of bridge that need to be addressed. Due to trail reroute, we recommend adding additional photo monitoring points to capture the new trail corridor. New photos were taken from the constructed bridge and additional photo locations will be considered during the next monitoring period (Q2-2025).

Plot 4: Trail tread and edges substantially more stabilized since previous monitoring period. Some limited planted was noted including kinnikinnick, osoberry, thimbleberry, salmonberry, snowberry, salal, and serviceberry. Orange trail fencing has been removed and wood straw was noted in places. A fair amount of common blackberry is present in the plot and should be considered for control, along with small amounts of common ivy. Large non-native English hawthorn and Portugal laurel still present. Some minor pruning of beaked hazelnut noted along trail edge. Stinging nettle and fringcups present. All transplanted sword ferns appear dead.

4. Use/disuse of social trails

One construction trail exists from Cheasty to Watercourse 1, will monitor to see if a social trail develops. Social trail from Cheasty Blvd down Andover ROW appears to be in less use than prior to construction. Restoration trails are in existence.

5. Damage and degradation to wetlands not protected by fencing

No damage or degradation to wetlands was observed, and straw wattles are in place on all trails.

6. Trash and dumping

Some trash and dumping observed, including shopping carts, tires and miscellaneous. Some appear to be from clean up from the trail construction crew, one was left over from an encampment that is no longer in place.

7. Corrective Actions this Quarter

GSP contractor and volunteers continued plantings in trail system area. Trail was mainly shut down due to first winter compacting, seep areas were observed that need to be adjusted in the spring but no work occurred this quarter outside of installing signage. Community members appear to have installed some wood/debris in seep spots in the trail to allow the paths to be walked on during the winter, these will be removed and repaired as part of the work toward Physical Completion for the project this summer.




Q1 How often do you visit the Cheasty Pedestrian and Mountain Bike Trail?






