






Play Area Gap Analysis

Walking Distance to Nearest Play Area












Priority Improvement Areas




High Priority

Planning Context


- Current use: Informal nude beach

 Classical forms reminiscent of Olmsted Design


 East Denny Blaine Place (road) and interior space under SPR jurisdiction





Design Opportunities

- Nature play emphasis in Shoreline Conservation Zone
- ADA route of travel from ADA parking to beach
- Bridging nature with historic symmetry
- Natural materials in keeping with granite walls and shoreline logs
- Simplicity in keeping with Olmsted park design
- Maximal play value by focusing on single element of play
