





WebEx Meeting Format














Project Goals








What We Heard: Existing Features

On a scale from 1 to 5, where 1 means "extremely important" and 5 means "not important at all", how important is it to provide a new racket court at Lowman Beach Park?













What We Heard: New Racket Court

F: Alternative court colors












What We Heard: Park Amenities










Concept 1: Full Size Multi-Sport Court



BENEFITS:

- Full size tennis court
- Accommodates pickleball and other hard surface activities
- Accessible swing area

IMPACTS:

- Loss of open lawn space
- Fence partially obstructs views
- Swing encroaches towards daylighted creek
- North side of court under drip line of existing tree










Concept 2A: Medium Size Court + Swings










Concept 2B: Medium Size Court + No Swings



BENEFITS:

- Less impact to open lawn than Concept 2A
- Accommodates pickleball and other activities
- No fencing needed
- No encroachment towards daylighted creek or existing trees

IMPACTS:

- Loss of open lawn space
- Does not provide enough hard surface for tennis
- No swings










Concept 3: Lawn and Amenities (No Court)

- No fencing needed

 Does not provide a hard surface to accommodate tennis, pickleball, or other activities
