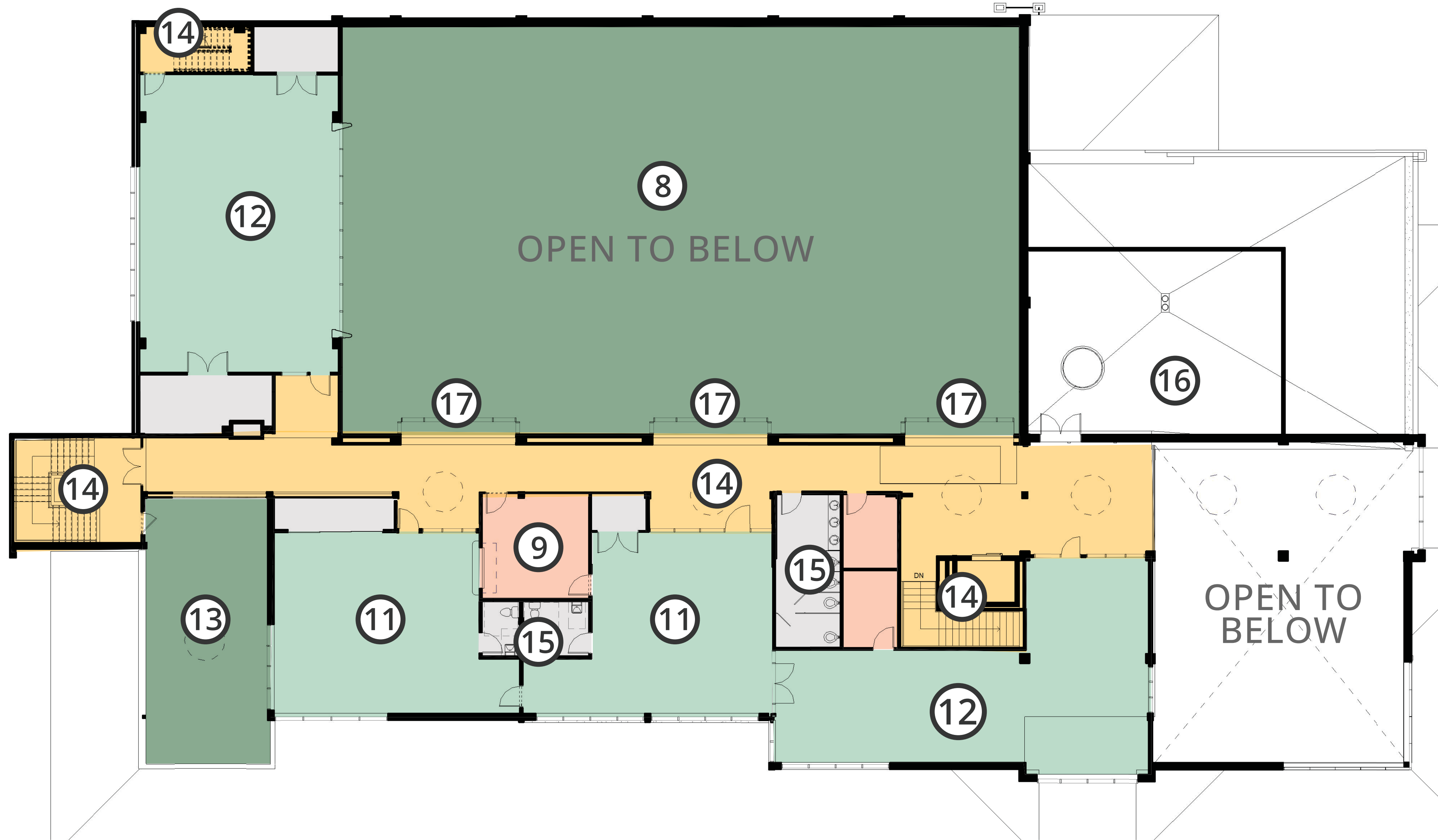

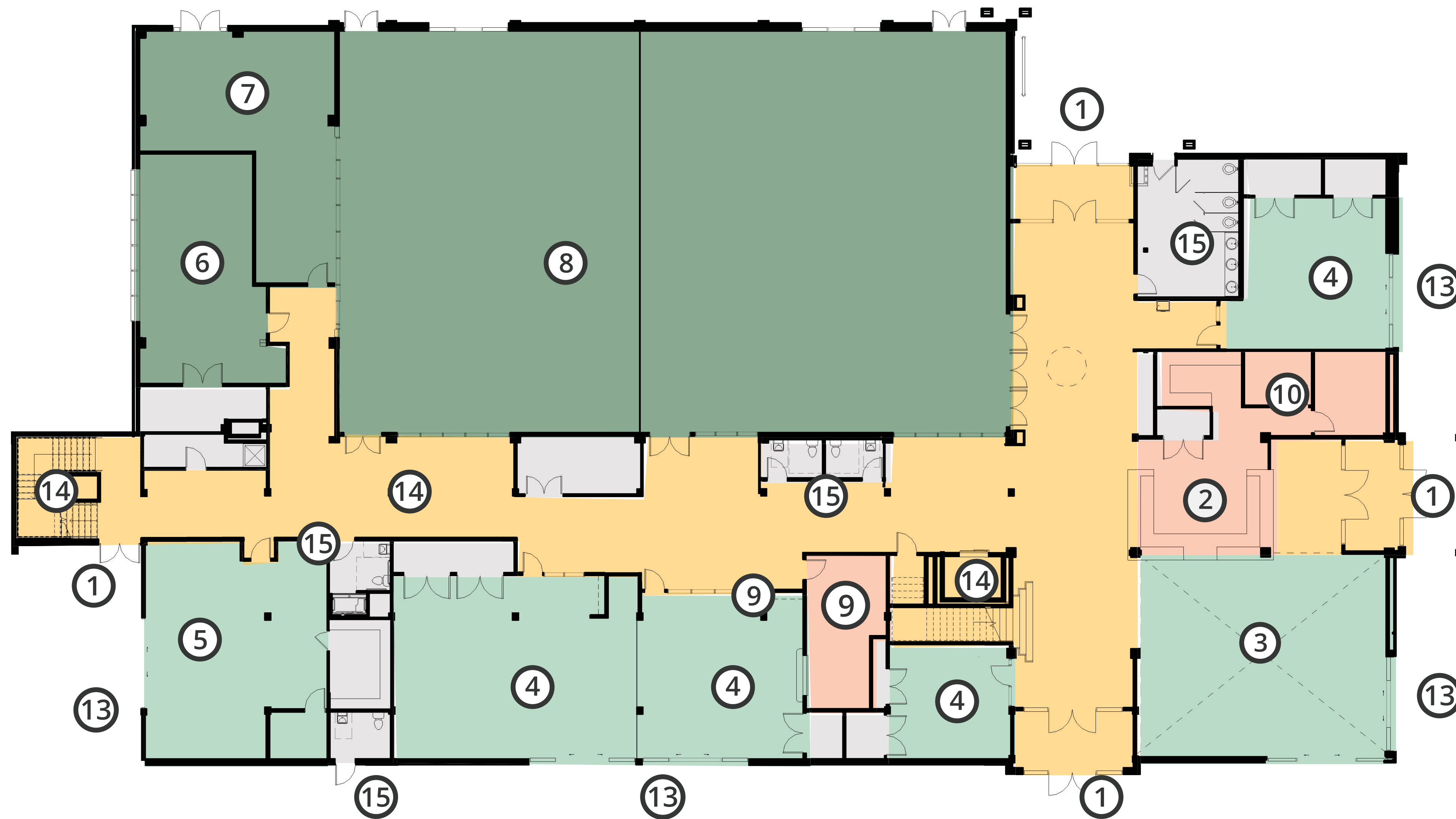

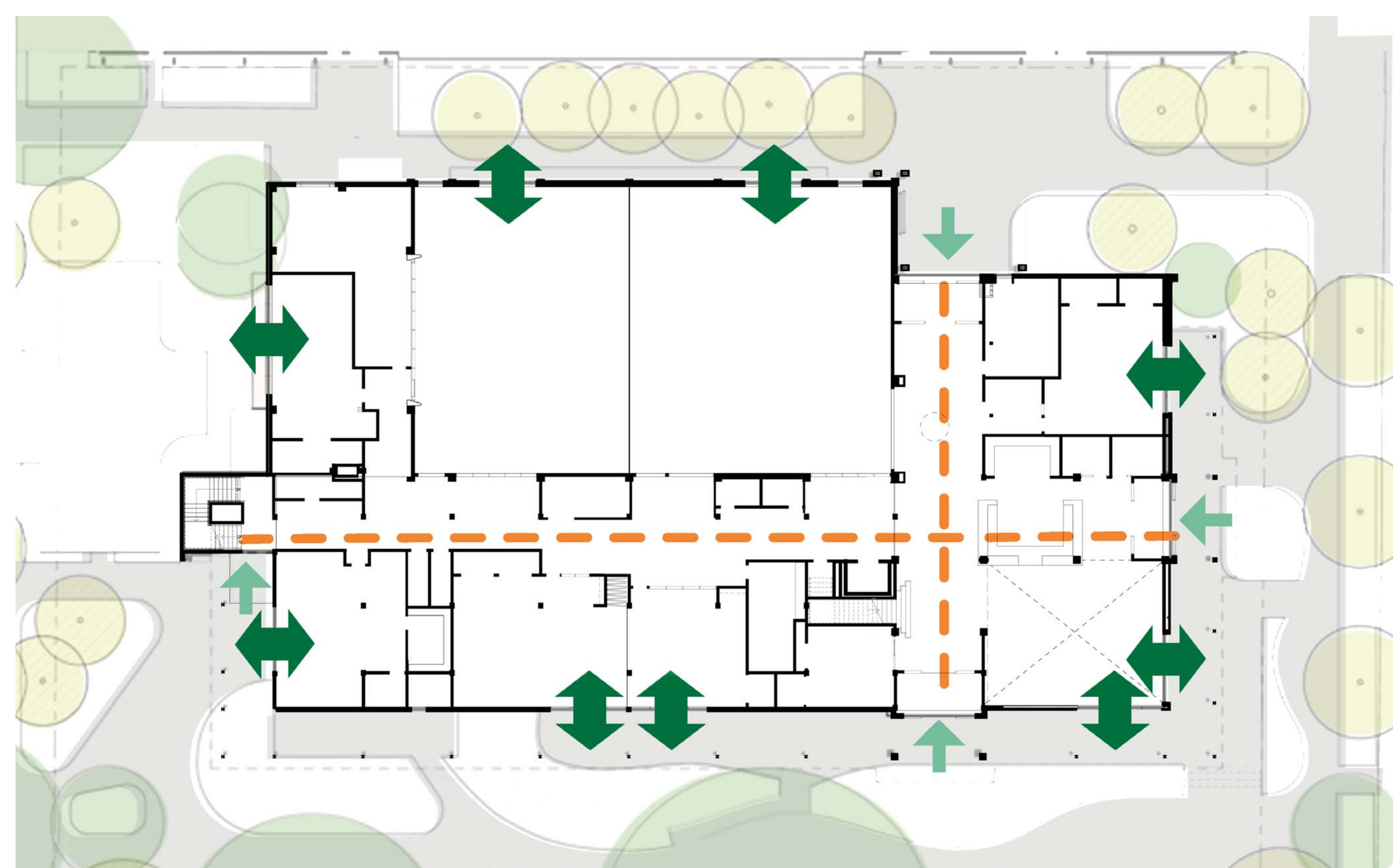

We're planning major renovations to bring the building up to today's needs—and make sure it stays strong and useful for the next 50 years.

### FLEXIBILITY

- Multi-use spaces throughout interior, for a variety of uses and functions.
- Active features and spaces in the outdoor landscape.

### SUSTAINABILITY

- Full building exterior upgrade for improved thermal performance.
- Enlarged windows for improved natural light.
- Improved canopies and landscape for shading.
- Replacement of aged building systems for improved energy efficiency.

### COMMUNITY CONNECTION

- A vibrant space for everyone, from Queen Anne and beyond, to gather and connect.
- Interior spaces with open connection to exterior, for active gathering.
- Transparency throughout the facility with better views between spaces.
- Updated entries at all sides of the building.

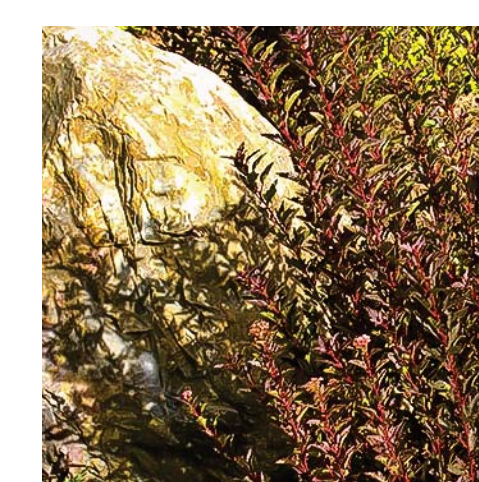
The plants chosen for the landscape are native, low-maintenance, and support year-round beauty and local wildlife.

## OUTDOOR FEATURES

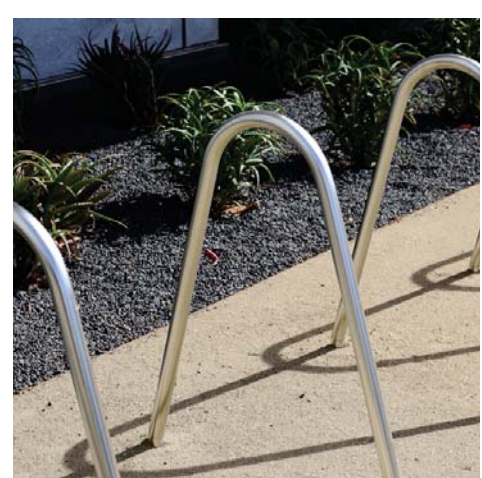


### OUTDOOR SPACES THAT WELCOME ALL

The building's exterior is designed to be warm, durable, and inviting—with materials that stand up to weather, support sustainability, and reflect the character of the community



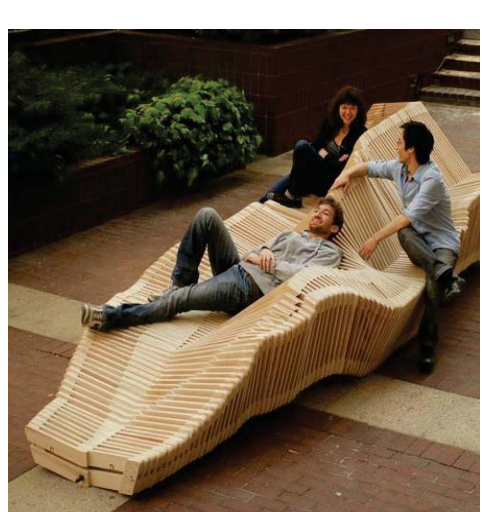
**1 Berm**  
A raised, grassy area that adds natural shaping to the landscape and can be used for casual seating or play.



**2 Bike Rack**  
A secure and convenient spot for visitors to park and lock their bikes



**3 Flexible Seating**  
Comfortable seating options for all to enjoy a variety of activities.



**4 Ping Pong**  
An outdoor table that encourages fun, active play and social interaction.



**5 Porch Seating**  
Seating on the covered porch extends the building's community gathering spaces.



**6 Rain Garden**  
A landscaped area that collects and filters rainwater, supporting native plants and reducing runoff.



**7 Seatwall Planters**  
Seating and places to rest along the active pedestrian spaces

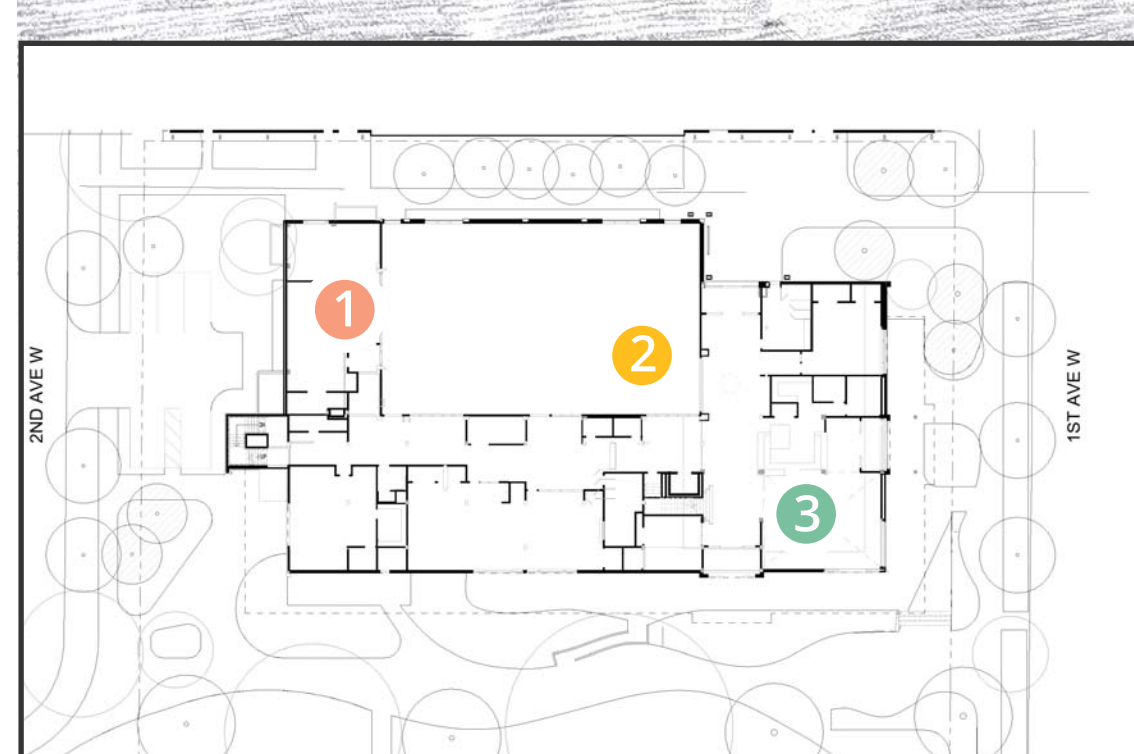

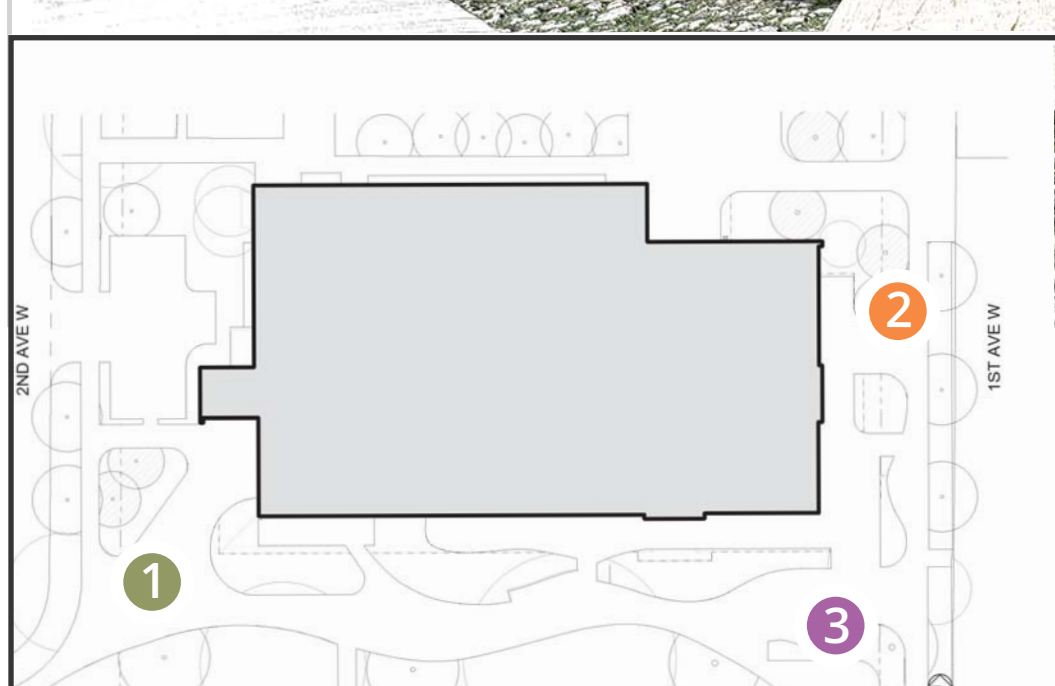
