2022 Member Annual Statements will be mailed by Monday, April 3, 2023. If you have not received your annual statement by May 1, 2023, please email us at [retirecity@seattle.gov](mailto:retirecity@seattle.gov) or call 206-386-1293.

Your 2022 Member Annual statement reflects your contributions and interest earned during 2022. This statement should be retained with your permanent records.

- **SCERS ID** is different than your City of Seattle employee number. This number has been assigned only to you and will follow you throughout your career with the City of Seattle, as well as through retirement.
- **Contributions during 2022** are the amount of retirement contributions you have paid to SCERS during 2022.
- **Interest earned during 2022** is the amount earned on your retirement contributions during 2022.
- **New balance as of December 31, 2022** is the total amount of your contributions and interest.
- Please check the home address listed on your statement. This is the address SCERS has on file for you. If your address is not current and you are no longer employed by the City, please submit a "[Change of Address Form](#)". Current employees should change their home address on Employee Self-Service.
- **Beneficiary(ies)**: If the member passes away before retirement, the designated beneficiary(ies) or eligible survivor(s) may be entitled to certain benefits depending upon the circumstances. If married at the time of death, the ACWI must be paid to the spouse, unless the spouse has signed a waiver of the right to the benefit. If you would like to change your beneficiary(ies) from the one(s) listed on your statement, please complete the [Beneficiary Designation form](#). Please note that the Social Security number of your beneficiary(ies) must be listed. Your signature must also be notarized.
