

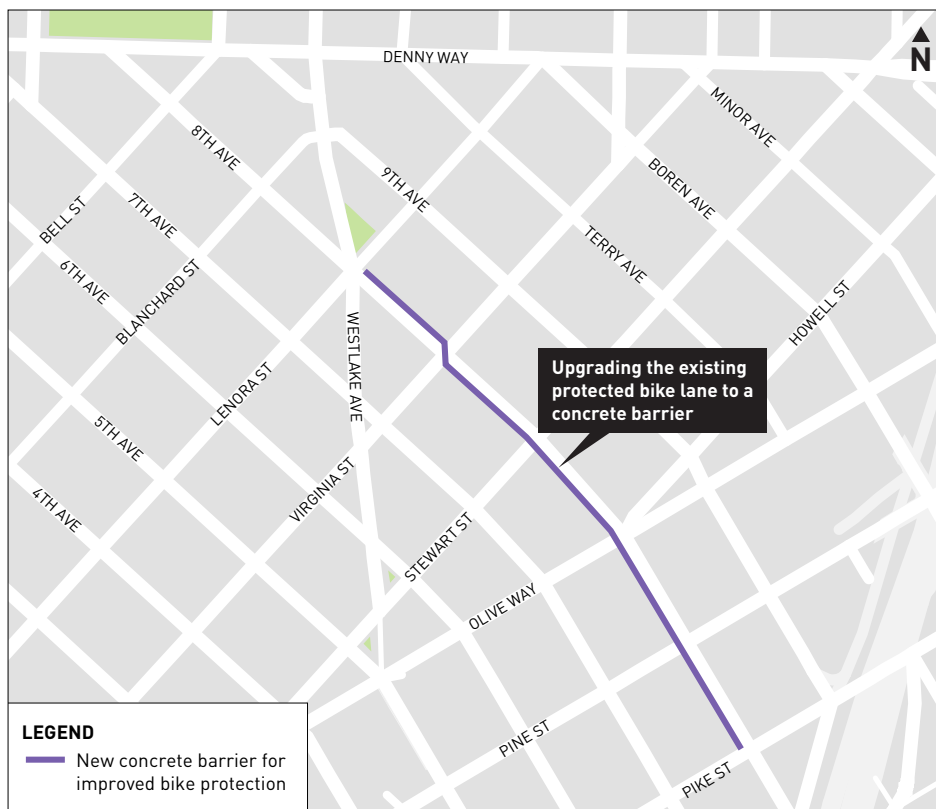


8th Ave Bike Lane Upgrades Beginning January 2023

Starting January 2023, the Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) will begin making upgrades to the existing bike lane on 8th Ave between Pike St and Lenora St. We will be upgrading the existing bike lane to a concrete structure.

NOTE: The bike path will be raised to the same level as the sidewalk and some driveways in places along 8th Ave

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- Increased construction presence; trucks, workers, equipment
- Noise, dust, and vibrations from equipment and trucks
- Temporary pedestrian and bike detours
- Temporary parking restrictions
- Temporary lane closures for cars
- This work will typically happen during the daytime with some nighttime work

BACKGROUND

In August 2019, SDOT crews installed new northbound bike connections on 8th Ave between Pike St and Bell St, and Pine St between 8th Ave and 6th Ave. In 2023, we will be upgrading the bike lane by replacing the paint and posts with a durable concrete buffer. PROJECT IMPROVEMENTS

- Increased safety and reliability by separating all modes of travel
- Raised bike lane at some driveways to reduce conflict
- Raised bike lane at some pedestrian loading areas to increase accessibility
- Lasting, durable barrier for increased safety

SCHEDULE

Construction will begin after the new year and last about 2 to 4 months.
