






## Aurora Park Path



## Challenge

#### Unsafe

- Narrow path
- Potholed + rooted
- Fast moving traffic

## COVID-19

Restrictions on inner path forced people to use outer path, putting more bicyclists, joggers, and walkers in harm's way.



## Opportunity

Aurora's Curbside Northbound Lane

- Not used for many years until restriped in Jan. 2020.
- Increases traffic speeds.
- Creates merge problems before/after Green Lake Park.

















## Opportunity

Create a Complete Outer Loop

- Two-way protected bikeway will be completed on north + east sides of the park this year.
- Keep It Moving St on south side.
- Installing jersey barrier in Aurora curbside lane + modifying West
  Green Lake Drive would create
  complete loop.












### Key Points

## Why Now?

- There are "99" Problems:
  - In the last 10 years, 22 people have been killed in crashes on Aurora.
  - Lack of "sense of place"
  - The pollution and traffic safety concerns are a matter of social justice: The people who live & work on Aurora tend to be people of color and lower income at higher rates than the surrounding neighborhoods and city as a whole.
