Vision Zero and the Safe System Approach

- Vision Zero is our goal to end traffic deaths and serious injuries on city streets
- The Safe System Approach centers on the idea of incorporating multiple layers of protection to:
 - Reduce the likelihood of crashes
 - Reduce severity when crashes occur



12th Ave S – Previous/Current Projects

2021

- Safety Corridor Project - Phase 1: Protected bike lanes from Jose Rizal Bridge to S King St

2024

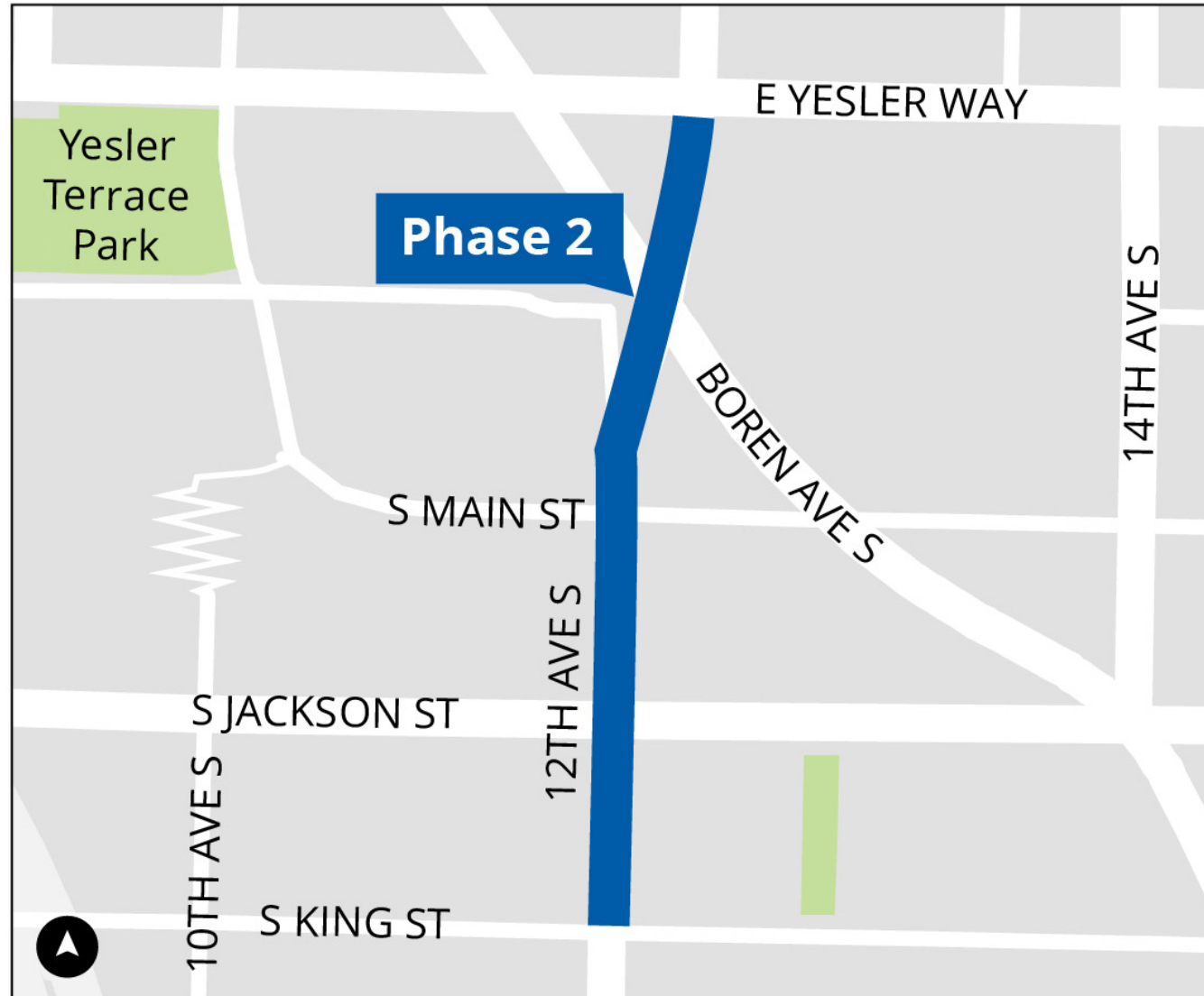
- 12th Ave/12th Ave S corridor-wide treatments:
 - Intersection daylighting, no turn on red, and head-start ped signals, etc.
 - Added protected/restricted turns at 12th/Yesler

2026

- Adding new southbound bike box and ped signal modifications at 12th/Yesler

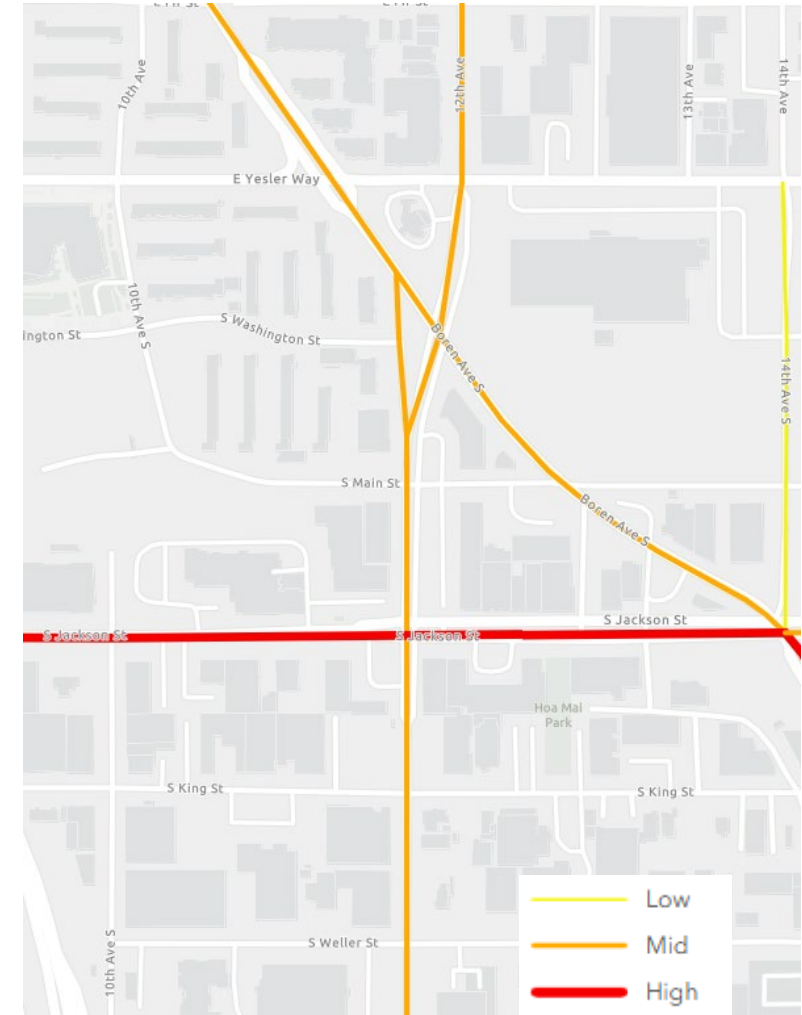


12th Ave S Safety Corridor Project - Phase 2



Crash History

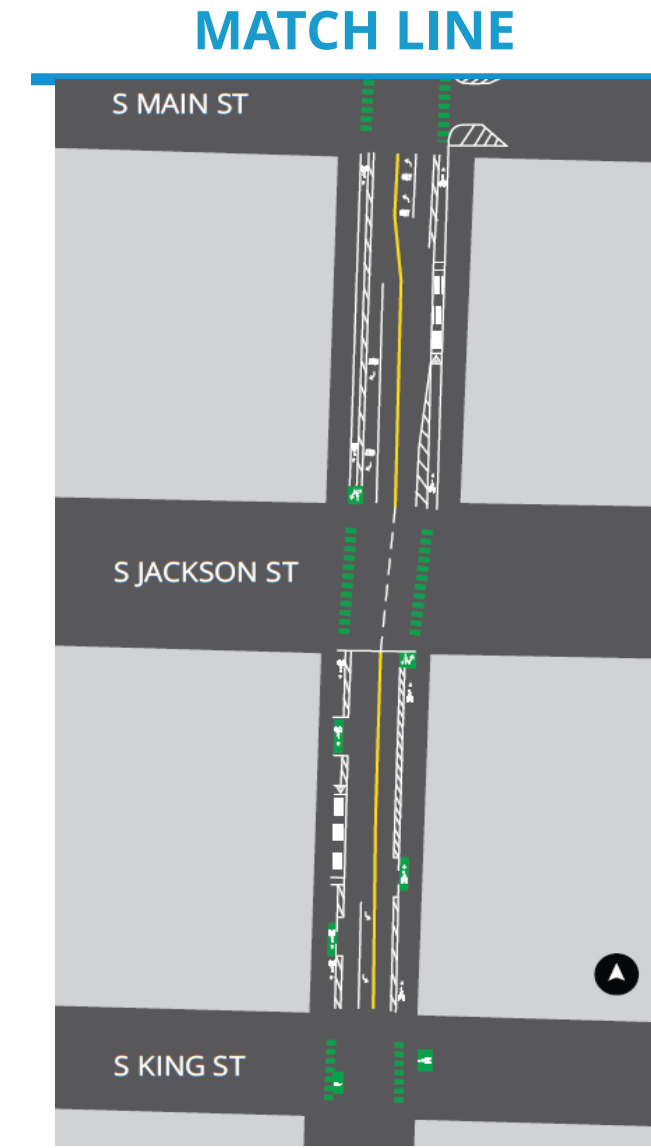
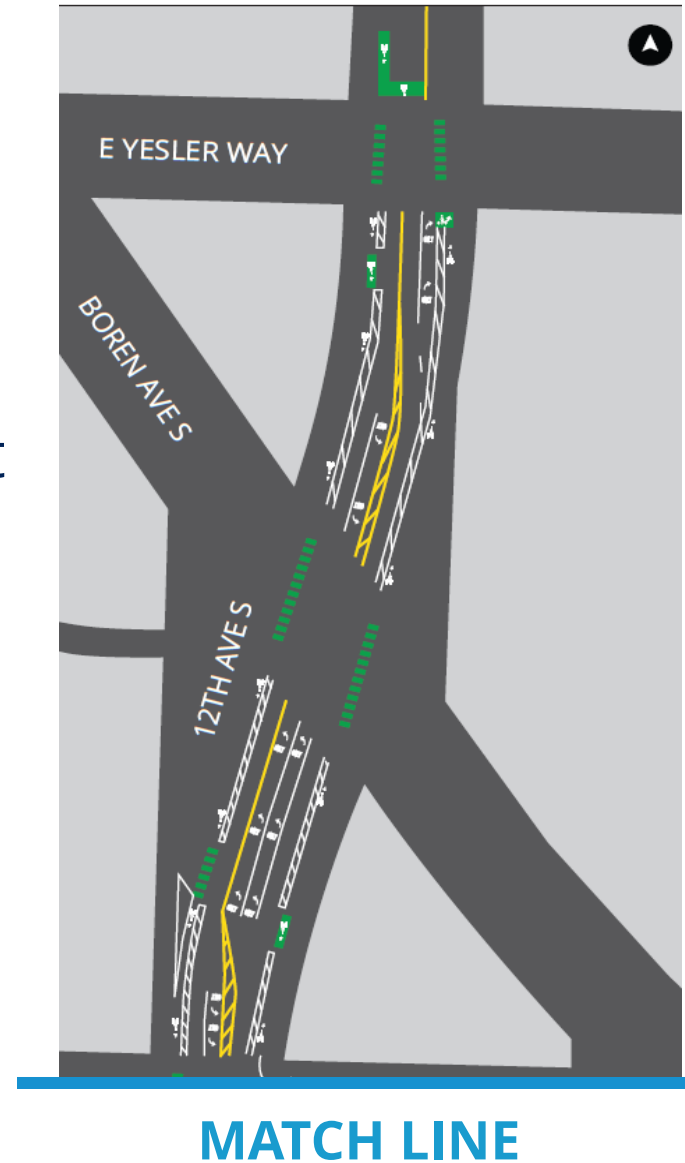
- 12th Ave S - Mid-tier street on **High Injury Network**
- 1/2023 – 6/2026: 38 crashes between Yesler and King:
 - 2 fatal
 - 3 serious injury
 - 18 injury
 - 6 involving people biking / on scooter
 - 9 involving people walking
- 12th Ave S & E Yesler Way was identified as a high collision intersection in 2012, 2020-2022, and 2025



12th Ave S prioritization within the High Injury Network

Proposed Project Scope

- Protected bike lanes
- Raised boarding platforms at bus stops
- Protected southbound right turn at 12th Ave S & S Jackson St
- Dedicated turn lanes for vehicles
- Additional load zones



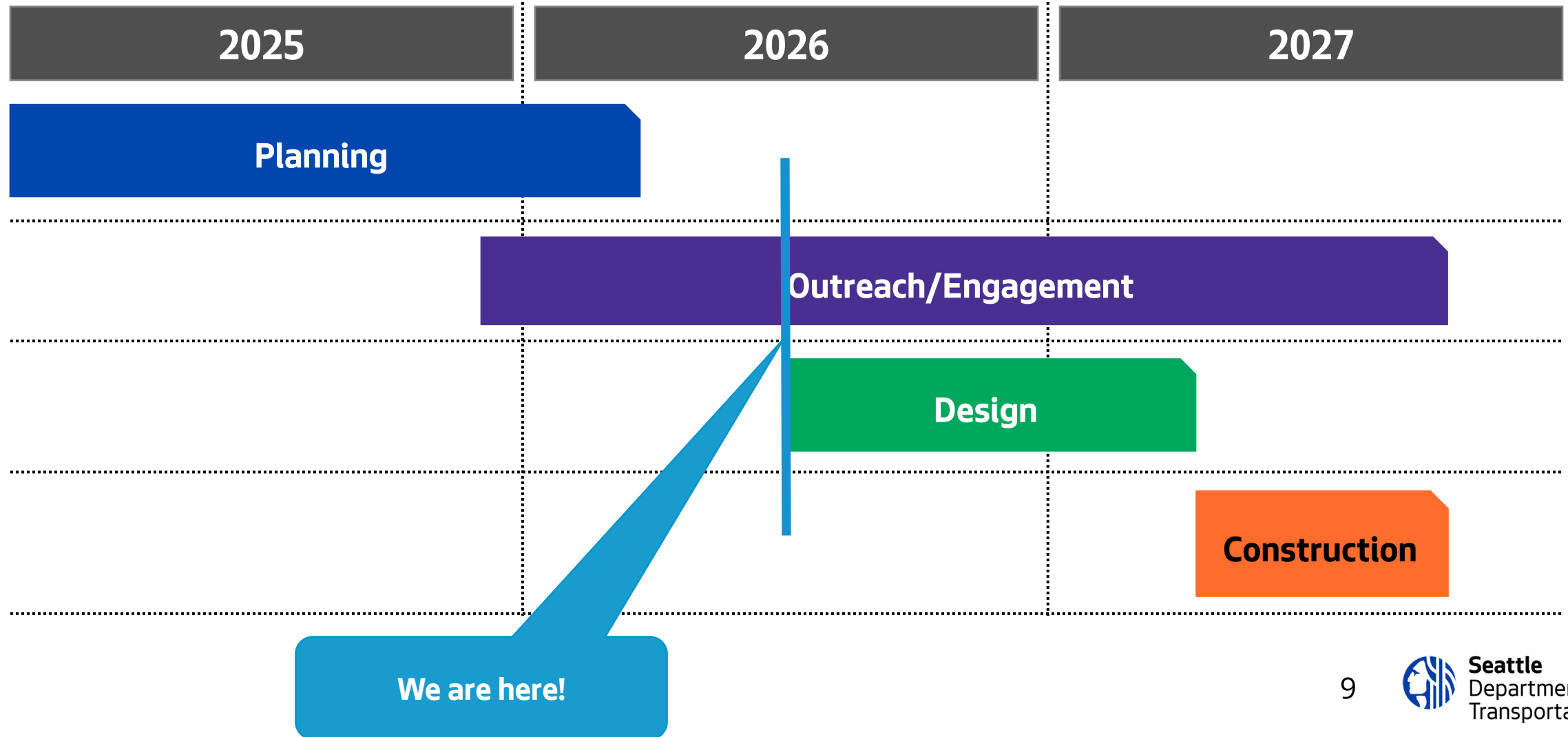
Project Coordination Needs

- Coordinate with Little Saigon businesses on access and loading operations
- Coordinate with King County Metro on bus stop changes and trolley wire alignment
- Coordinate with neighborhood stakeholders (e.g., International Special Review District)
- Coordination between project design and equipment suppliers

Timeline



Community Engagement

Early 2026

- Began preliminary engagement with community-based organizations
- Conducted survey to receive feedback on 12th Ave S and S Jackson St



Spring 2026

- Analyzed survey results and incorporated into project concepts
- Results indicated need for safety upgrades, including clarifying movements and upgrading ped/bike facilities



Summer/Fall 2026

- Share and solicit feedback on preliminary project designs



Early 2027

- Share final project designs
- Continue community outreach through project construction
