What is the Levy Annual Delivery Plan?



- ✓ Shows a list of work funded with Seattle Transportation Levy dollars that SDOT expects to progress in that year
- ✓ Includes the amount of funding appropriated to each program area in that year
- ✓ Informed by many factors
- ✓ Per a Council Resolution, this document is due to Seattle City Council each year

2026 Draft Levy Delivery Plan


- 2026 Draft Levy Delivery Plan published Jan. 30
 - Incorporates lessons learned on new programs
 - Careful consideration of how WSDOT Revive I-5 work and FIFA World Cup may impact Levy delivery
 - Public opportunity to review plan

2026 Draft Levy Delivery Plan

- Over 430 investments including:
 - Projects that the department plans to start or advance building, designing, and planning in 2026
 - Operations and Maintenance efforts
 - Program development and implementation
- \$190.6 million appropriated to portfolio in 2026 budget
- Due to complex nature of capital project delivery and unforeseen risks, adjustments to the workplan may be necessary

Pedestrian-Specific 2026 Planned Investments

- Start construction on **Renton Ave S & Spring St Safety Corridors**
- **21 High Collision Safety Projects**
- More **Accessible Pedestrian Signals** citywide
- **Neighborhood Traffic Calming** – 16 streets (across two programs)
- Advance **Aurora Ave N** planning/engagement
- Continue construction on new **sidewalks, crossing improvements, protected bike lane upgrades**



2025 High-Collision Safety Project on Rainier Ave S between S Charlestown St and S Andover St .


Pedestrian-Specific 2026 Planned Investments

- **S Henderson St** School Safety Project, including protected bike lanes
- 51 new **Leading Pedestrian Intervals**
- Start **Neighborhood Initiated Safety Partnership Program** projects
- **Pedestrian lighting** in CID
- **Safe Routes to Schools** projects citywide
- Ongoing **crossing improvements, sidewalk repair** and **curb ramp** construction

Other 2026 Levy Investment Highlights



- Start construction of **10 new EV charging sites**
- Continue **Low-Pollution Neighborhood** planning
- Strategic **neighborhood-focused street tree planting**
- Progress on paving projects on **Pinehurst Way NE & Roosevelt Way NE**
- **MLK Pedestrian Bridge** Preservation project progress
- Starting/advancing construction on new **Neighborhood Greenways and protected bike lane upgrades**
- Progress on **new traffic signals** including construction on 20th Ave SW and SW Roxbury St



Georgetown Healthy Street and Neighborhood Greenway, which includes elements for safety and traffic calming such as speed humps, Healthy Street signs, concrete sign bases, concrete planters, and painted curb bulbs with flexible posts at intersections

Other 2026 Levy Investment Highlights

- **Transit spot improvements** citywide, including on major corridors Delridge Way SW and 3rd Ave
- Advancing planning and/or design on connections and access to Link light rail stations including CID, N 130th St, Judkins Park, and S Graham St
- Preparing **for FIFA World Cup & supporting Revive I-5** including through Intelligent Transportation Systems improvements
- Construction on **Fortson Square** and **Thomas St Plaza** People Streets & Public Spaces programs
