- Request/require ped board input on every project
- Create a users priority framework that puts safety > car travel time by

default, inclusive of accessibility considerations

- Idea: Ask to accept state level of traffic stress (Bellevue/Kirkland have this)
- Route directness standards
- Accessibility don't accept less than universal design
- Sidewalk maintenance
 - Grant for data collection
 - Accessibility (eg leaves) via property owners is not working. Should

be the city.

- How to handle community input via homemade crosswalks etc (suggestions beyond waiting till fatality/injury data mandates)
